Washing only full loads of laundry can save an average household more than 3,400 gallons of water each year.

WATER SAVING TIP



Water your yard thoroughly, but only as needed usually no more than 1 inch, once a week.

Fix faucet leaks, which can waste up to 3,000 gallons of water a year.

Turn off the water while you brush your teeth and save up to 4 gallons a minute. That's up to 200 gallons a week for a family of four.

If you use a low-flow shower head, you can save 15 gallons of water during a 10-minute shower.

Installing water efficient plumbing fixtures can reduce water consumption by 25 to 60 percent and save energy, too. Look for the WaterSense label to help you find high-performing, water efficient products.

Plug the sink instead of running the water to rinse your razor and save up to 300 gallons a month.
