Mrs. Edith E. McIllmurray,
wife of Dr. Morgan McIllmurray,
died unexpectedly in her home
Tuesday, June 16.

Born Edith Estelle Jackson,
August 16, 1893, near Calumet,
she was the youngest child of
the late Mr. and Mrs. Samuel
Jackson, former residents of Bad
Axe. She attended schools near
Calumet, was a graduate of Bad
Axe high school, also of the
State Teacher's college, Ypsilanti.
She taught in the Bad Axe
and Elkton school 16 years.

She was married July 21, 1923
to Dr. McIllmurray at Decker-
ville. They took up their resi-
dence in Elkton and have lived
there since.

Survivors are her husband;
one sister, Mrs. Lyla Carlson
of Detroit, and several nieces
and nephews.
