#### **FIVE GROUPS THE FIRST WEEK**

To ensure you are registering for the correct group, please include this information on your "top choices" study group list that you will refer to during your online registration!

**Study Group Fees** - The study group fee for individuals is \$20 per group. Pairs/Couples groups are \$40. Some groups have additional fees listed. These are based on the group's activity (i.e., venue admission, lunch expenses, facility fees, and materials).

Study Group fees make up the administrative budget of the chapter, with any excess funds going to support the Brandeis University library.

Membership Status and Email - Please be sure your <u>BNC</u> <u>Phoenix chapter membership</u> is current, and your contact information is up to date. Make certain your email is unique to you — partners/spouses may not share an email.

### **How to Register for Study Groups**

### BEFORE YOU BEGIN, PLEASE READ THESE

#### WATCH FOR THE EBLAST ALERTING YOU TO WHEN REGISTRATION IS OPEN AND THE LINK IS ACTIVE.

- ⇒ If you are registering for the first time, click on the REGISTRATION LINK on the BNC Phoenix Study Group page of the BNC website.
- ⇒ Fill out your personal data, scroll down and hit "save and continue." You will be asked if you are a BNC member or not. If you are not a current member, please go to the BNC Membership page to do so, before continuing your registration.
- ⇒ The next pages in the registration system list all study groups by days of the week. You can now scroll through the list to find your preferred group using the Study Guide and your "Top Five" list as a reference.
- $\Rightarrow~$  Open the drop-down box to add the registration fee. You must click on that box.
- ⇒ For our pairs/couples groups you will need to also enter your Additional Person's first & last name. They need to be a chapter member, too. One person will pay for both participants.
- ⇒ For the first week of our chapter-wide registration, you may select up to 5 groups and hit "**next.**"

### **How to Register for Study Groups**

- ⇒ If the group(s) you want are no longer available, you will see a message saying so. At the bottom of the form, you may add your name to any waitlists for groups that are not currently available.
- ⇒ The screen that opens will summarize your personal information, list the total price for your group(s) and ask for your credit card information.
- $\Rightarrow$  Enter the requested information and click on "next."
- ⇒ The last screen lists the group(s) for which you registered and paid. Verify all information. Then click on "SUBMIT."
- ⇒ If you clicked on "SUBMIT", a final screen will open with the completed registration form. It will include any groups for which you are waitlisted. You are not charged for any waitlisted groups.
- ⇒ You will receive an email from BNC with your registration information, which can also serve as a receipt. SAVE THIS EMAIL!\* Make sure <u>brandeis.edu</u> is in your favorites/ contact list so this email does not go to SPAM.
- ⇒ This confirmation email contains a link if you wish to register for additional groups starting the second week of the chapter-wide registration. Click on the link that says, "Edit my registration" and continue to add study groups. Do not create a new record under a different email address!






