Sunday Reflection: First Sunday of Advent

The word Advent signifies "coming" or "arrival." At its heart, this sacred season invites us to prepare for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ in His First Advent and to awaken our longing for His return as Christ the King in His Second Advent. Advent, therefore, is far more than commemorating an event that occurred two millennia ago. It is a living celebration of a profound divine truth: that God has revealed Himself in Christ so that all creation may be reconciled to Him. This mystery is not merely historical; it is an unfolding reality in which we ourselves are called to participate, awaiting its ultimate fulfillment. Accordingly, the Scripture readings during Advent emphasize the promise of Christ's return, calling us to accountability in faithfulness, awareness of divine judgment on sin, and renewed hope in the gift of eternal life.

This dual orientation—looking back to Christ's birth and forward to His glorious return—also mirrors the spiritual journey of every believer and of the entire Church community. In Advent, we proclaim that Christ has already come in the flesh, that He remains present and active in our world today through the Holy Spirit, and that He will one day return in power and majesty. As the Church rejoices in God's decisive entry into human history through the Incarnation, it simultaneously anticipates the final fulfillment of His plan, for which "all creation is groaning, awaiting redemption." Although Advent is often experienced as a time of joyful expectation, it is equally intended to be a period of sincere preparation. The Church invites us to deepen our prayer, embrace penance, and practice fasting, allowing our hearts to be purified and made ready for the Lord's coming. In this spirit of hope, reflection, and renewal, may this Advent season be for all of us a time of abundant grace, spiritual growth, and profound blessing. I wish you all a holy and grace-filled Advent season.

Saint of the Week... St. Francis Xavier


Jesus asked, "What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?" (Matthew 16:26a). The words were repeated to a young teacher of philosophy who had a highly promising career in academics, with success and a life of prestige and honor before him.

Francis Xavier, 24 at the time, and living and teaching in Paris, did not heed these words at once. They came from a good friend, Ignatius of Loyola, whose tireless persuasion finally won the young man to Christ. In 1534, Francis joined Ignatius' little community, the infant Society of Jesus. He was ordained a priest in 1537, and sailed to the East Indies, landing at Goa, on the west coast of India. For the next 10 years he labored to bring the faith to such widely scattered peoples as the Hindus, the Malayans, and the Japanese. Wherever he went, Xavier lived with the poorest people, sharing their food and rough accommodations. He spent countless hours ministering to the sick and the poor.

Xavier then traveled to Japan. He learned enough Japanese to preach, instruct, baptize, and establish missions. From Japan he had dreams of going to China, but this plan was never realized. Before reaching the mainland, he died. His remains are enshrined in the Church of Good Jesus in Goa. He and St. Thérèse of Lisieux were declared co-patrons of the missions in 1925.

St. Francis Xavier was canonized in 1622 at the same ceremony as Ignatius of Loyola. He is the patron saint of Catholic missions, sailors, Japan and jewelers.
