## News from Fort Dauphin and the Friends of Toliara


The child sponsorship program in the Diocese of Toliara will be six years old in September of this year. Originally, it was conceived to provide financial help for the clergy in the Diocese but quickly grew into an instrument to help children's education throughout the Diocese.

In the newest "Friends of Toliara" Newsletter, there are stories of two boys, one a child now and one an adult, who have been helped by the sponsorship program. Soja is in fourth grade and is doing very, very well in school. He lives with his big brother who is a water seller. Thanks to the sponsorship program, he is attending private school in Amboasary with not only his tuition, supplies and fees covered but medical fees as well. The second story is about Fiadanana, the education coordinator for the Diocese. Fiadanana's father is a priest in the Diocese so he is one of the clergy children who benefitted from the sponsorship from primary school through high school. Not only is Fiadanana working for the Diocese of Toliara but he also has been attending

the university in Toliara and will graduate soon with a degree in agriculture.

The cost of sponsorship is increasing in September and will rise from \$25 to \$30. During the past six years, there has not been any increase in the cost but, alas, everything is getting more expensive even in Madagascar!!!
