

## Proposition 1

On April 25<sup>th</sup>, 2017 voters will have the option to approve Spokane County's Proposition 1. Proposition 1 continues the existing 1/10<sup>th</sup> of 1% of local sales and use tax that keeps Spokane Count's emergency communication systems and services functional. If Proposition 1 passes, Spokane County law and fire agencies will maintain the emergency communications system that integrates 911, Police, Fire, EMS staff, and Crime Check, as well as enhance the systems technology and capabilities.
