May Reflection

Revelation 21:5 "And the one who was seated on the throne said, 'See I am making all things new."

Back in the spring of 2019 Eli had just turned three Ella was still an infant, and Crystal and I took the kids to Dollywood, and we had the best family day. Eli couldn't do a lot but oh he loved those rides. Ella couldn't ride rides, but she loved riding the train, and looking at Dolly's sparkling dresses. As we drove back to our home in Canton we talked about how that was absolutely the best family day we had ever had.

In light of that we made the wise financial decision to buy season tickets to Dollywood because we were going to go every Saturday for the rest of the year, this was about one week before I received a call from my DS that I would be moved to Cherryville. All the sudden those season tickets didn't seem like such a good idea, we decided we needed to make the most of them. That spring break we stayed at the Dollywood hotel, and every day we went to the park. Eli really wanted to ride a roller coaster, and there was only one that he could so on the last day I took him on that roller coaster.

I was certain this was going to be a core memory for him, father/son roller coaster ride, gotta be up there with catching your first fish and learning to shave. As soon as they put the lap bar over him his eyes got wide, as we started to climb a great big drop Eli looked at me and said, "I want to get out!!! I don't like this!!! Why would you do this to me!!!" Then we hit the drop and he dug his nails so far into my arm, I am fairly certain I still have the scars. As we got off and Crystal and Ella greeted us, Eli ran tears in his eyes to his mama and said, "Don't let me go with daddy again, he tried to kill me!!!" Which is not the best thing to have your three year old scream in a crowded amusement park.

Later that day after he got calmed down some, I asked him what he thought about roller coasters, and he said, "I kind of liked it for a minute, I'm glad I did it, and I liked it a lot when it was over." I asked him if he would do it again, he said, "maybe when I get old...like 7."

Contrary to his prediction he has rode many roller coasters, before and after the old age of 7. A few days ago when I asked him about the experience he said, "I like the end, I don't like each twist, turn, or drop, but I like the feeling I get at the end." Over these past few weeks, I have been thinking it is important we know where we are trying to go.

The book of Revelation contains some of the most cryptic language and most fanciful imagery in the entire Bible. It has been used to try to forecast the events of the end times, as well as to call hopeless Christians to fortitude and endurance. It's lectionary placement in the season of Easter is notable, as it draws us to another contemporary application of this book: as a guide to experiencing resurrected life.

John's vision allows us to see the world, the church and the Christian life in the way that God envisions it: not for how it is but for how it can be. And each week, through the power of the one who makes all things new, we are called to make those possibilities a resurrection reality.

So in this season after Easter we are going to do something a little bit different. Between now and Pentecost at First UMC we are going to do a sermon series on the book of Revelation. Each week we will look at different passages from Revelation in order to hear how we can embrace resurrection and practice it in our lives here and now.

On May 4 we will look at Rev 1:4-8 and we will see how Revelation calls us to hope and endurance for today. On May 11 we will celebrate Mother's Day and welcome our confirmands into membership in our church. On May 18 we will look at Rev 5:11-14 and we will see that through worship we embody and enact eternity. On May 25 Rev 7:9-17 will give of an ideal picture of the church that we can work to become today. On June 1 we will use Rev 21:10, 22-22:5 to hear the wonderful good news that Heaven is not just a hope for tomorrow; it is a promise to be claimed now. On June 8 we will celebrate the birthday of the church through Pentecost in which we are reminded that the Holy Spirit empowers us to live out the resurrection today.

I encourage you in these upcoming weeks to do a very un-Methodist thing and add the practice of reading through the book of Revelation over these next six weeks. I know that can seem to be a very daunting task, as the book of Revelation contains vivid and fearful imagery. But once you begin to understand the apocalyptic prose, what emerges is a profound promise of God's presence in the midst of a turbulent and chaotic world, and the assurance that no matter how pronounced and insidious the presence of evil and sin are in the world, the work of God through Jesus Christ is superior, the same Holy Spirit which resides in each Christian is more powerful than everything else in the world. It is indeed news worth sharing and worth our reflection as we enter into a new season of church life. I look forward to taking this journey with you, and I look forward to what God is going to do with us here at First United Methodist.
