The book of Acts is known for the expansion of the church mostly based on paul's work and missionary journeys. In its very early years, the church would not be expanded unless there was martyrdom. We saw it in <u>Acts 7:54-60</u> with Stephen and we see it again in <u>Acts 12</u> with Peter, who was spared his execution because of the **prayers** of the people pf the churches.

In Acts 12, Herod was the ruler who killed James the brother of John in an effort to please the Jews and probably because he enjoyed the bloodshed himself.

When Herod saw the enjoyment the religious leaders got from the death of James, he wanted to martyr Peter also. So he put Peter in prison and kept him with excessive soldiers to be sure he would not escape. And if Peter did escape the soldiers lost their lives.

The church prayed for Peter for a long time that God might do something for him. And, quite to their surprise, God did save Peter from prison. The miraculous happened..



In Acts 8, Stephen was stoned to death because he told the truth about the religious leaders of his day: they denied Jesus Christ as Savior. I wonder if those leaders didn't enjoy the blood-shed as much as Herod or ISIS as well?
