Summer School:

- MCPS is planning system-wide courses for summer 2022, primarily in July. Registration begins in April.
- MCPS OSA recently reported on MCPS summer school 2021:
- 44,552 students (50% from ES) participated in 2021.
- Students reported socioemotional benefits from summer school 2021.
- Students showed improved outcomes on MCPS internal assessments.
- Students had mixed results on fall external assessments (MAP).

Virtual School:

- MCPS paved the way to temporarily replace snow days with virtual learning due to excess snow days already held in 2021-22. Virtual school on a snow day will begin on a 2-hour delay and will be a minimum of four hours long.

- Registration begins for full time online school in the Virtual Academy in 2022-23. Rolling admissions reviews begin March 1.
- National MAP data indicates student academic slide (grades 3-8) continued in 2021, compared to 2019
- National ACT data indicates student academic slide (grades 9-12) continued in 2021, with students missing 2-3 months of instruction.
