Since 2001, Grief's Journey, formerly Ted E. Bear Hollow has been a welcoming safe place where grieving children, teens and adults find hope. As the region's cornerstone for grief support, they provide free peer support programs as well as education and consultation thought out Nebraska and Iowa.

Adults and youth, ages 3 and up come to our free support programs, following a death or during a serious illness/injury. There, they find hope, build support and connect with others who "get it". They recognize that there is no timeline to grief and there is no right or wrong way to grieve, so they offer a variety of programs to meet their needs, Programs: Monthly Family Support Groups, 8 Session Family Support Groups, Family Days, Camp HOPE/teen Camp, Adults Helping Adults, and Serious Illness/Injury Support Groups.

Magdalene Omaha is a two year residential recovery and economic empowerment program for women who survived prostitution/sex trafficking, addition and abuse. The program is unique in its reliance on community, and its use of peer mentors and survivor leaders to run the program as they progress through the program and after they graduate. Upon graduation, as part of their outreach programs, they are able to help women still stuck in the life to see that recovery can happen, and help them to also find their way home. They are unique in that they are the only program that offers all of the services Nebraska sex trafficking survivors identified as needed for recovery.

Magdalene residents meet individualized achievement milestones at approximately six-month intervals. The first six months is a chance to heal form the trauma that these women experience as they begin to receive all the medical, dental, mental health and substance abuse treatment each women may need. The second six months they provide Intensive educational programming, life skills education, plus financial, and vocational training.

Vision: Feed the hungry by rescuing the heartland's bounty that would otherwise go to waste.

Mission: Connect perishable food from local food purveyors to local nonprofits that feed our hungry, while raising

awareness and education the community on food waste and hunger.

Saving Grace is a perishable food rescue and delivery - nonprofit agency, that picks up food donations in refrigerated trucks from local restaurants, caterers, cafeterias, delis, grocers and food purveyors. The food they receive is not warehoused, but delivered the same day, free of charge, matching the food donations to the needs of local non-profit agencies that serve our hungry neighbors. Food rescue, also called food recovery, is the practice of retrieving perishable food that would otherwise go to waste and distributing it to those in need, the food is perfectly edible but not saleable. This organization furnishes food for Open Door Mission, YES, Grief Journey, and other programs administering help in Omaha.

Saving Grace would use our donation towards the purchase of another refrigerated truck.
