- **SPECIALS NIGHTS:**
 - **Student Night:** *TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 4, 2018* - Student Discount Coupons are distributed through most schools in Shelby County. Present the coupon at the Ticket Booth for Discount. One Coupon per student. Coupons not valid for adult admission.
 - **Sr. Adult Night:** *THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 6, 2018*. Admission will be \$6 for those 55+.
 - **Military Discount:** Military personnel, active duty or retired, who present a current and valid Military ID will be given a \$2 Discount off General Admission.

GENERAL RULES

Rules 1-26 Apply to ALL Departments.

Each Department has special rules right below the Department Heading numbered alphabetically.

- 1) The Shelby County Fair is sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Columbiana. The Alabama Department of Agriculture and Industries pays a portion of the premiums and is a co-sponsor of the Shelby County Fair.
- 2) The Kiwanis Club of Columbiana, Inc. ("KIWANIS") reserves the right to construe its own rules and regulations, and to determine all matters and differences pertaining thereto, including but not limited to, making necessary changes in classes.
- 3) **OPERATING HOURS** will be posted on the Schedule of Events on our website. During anytime the Fair is not open to the public, no one except Kiwanis volunteers and staff will be allowed in the Exhibition Center or on the Fair Grounds.
- 4) **ADMISSION** to the Fair Grounds is \$12 per person. Admission includes all rides, admission to the Exhibition Hall and entertainment. There may be novelty attractions which require additional purchase.
- 5) **ADVANCE TICKETS** may be purchased on our website for only \$11. Advance tickets may be used any day of the Fair during normal operating hours. Advance ticket purchases are NON-REFUNDABLE.
- 6) In the event, there are technical or other difficulties with the Advance Ticket website, the site may be temporarily or permanently shut down, but tickets already purchased will be honored.
- 7) **SECURITY** will be furnished. However, KIWANIS, its officers, members, volunteers or agents will not be responsible for any accident, loss, theft or damage.
- 8) **EXHIBITORS** from all Alabama counties are welcome, except where noted. One Exhibitor per Registration Form.
- 9) **ALL RULES AND FORMS ARE AVAILABLE FOR VIEWING OR DOWNLOADING ON OUR WEBSITE.** A limited number of printed copies will be available at the locations listed in Rule #10.
- 10) **REGISTRATION FORMS AND ENTRY TAGS** will be available beginning July 20, 2018 at the Shelby County Extension Office, Mid-State Co-Op in Columbiana and all Shelby County Libraries.
- 11) Perishable items which spoil during the Fair and are no longer attractive as exhibits will be disposed of.
- 12) **NEW DIVISIONS AND/OR CLASSES** New Divisions will be highlighted in gray. Any new class in an existing Division will be **bold and underlined**.
- 13) **AGE REQUIREMENTS.** Adult Divisions are for exhibitors age 19 and older and Youth Divisions are for exhibitors under age 19 as of Fair Opening (September 4, 2018). Ages for Livestock Shows vary by show; please refer to individual show rules.
- 14) **REGISTRATION** is the process of getting Exhibitor and Competitive Exhibit information entered into Fair management software. This is done by completing a paper EXHIBIT REGISTRATION form and bringing the completed form along with ENTRIES with you to EXHIBIT CHECK-IN. If you complete EXHIBIT REGISTRATION forms manually and do NOT enter them online, your REGISTRATION will be completed by Fair Volunteers at EXHIBIT CHECK-IN. Alternately, you may REGISTER using our Online Registration website, see Rules 18-20 for more information.
- 15) **EXHIBIT CHECK-IN** is the process of Fair volunteers comparing the entries you bring to the Fair to EXHIBIT REGISTRATION or the ONLINE RECEIPT you print after entering entries online. Volunteers will also verify TAG IDs or WEB ENTRY NUMBER, and proper class of each item. Volunteers may suggest a different class but ultimately it is the Exhibitor's responsibility to select the proper class.
- 16) It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to put their entries in the correct class; failure to do so will result in disqualification.

- 17) All entries must be made by, created by, or contributed to by the Exhibitor entering the item. NO MORE THAN ONE ENTRY PER EXHIBITOR IN ANY CLASS, EXCEPT LIVESTOCK classes.
- 18) Unless stated otherwise in specific Department or Division rules, ALL entries must be CHECKED-IN by 5 PM, Saturday, September 1, 2018.
- 19) ONLINE REGISTRATION IS HIGHLY RECOMMENDED and can be found on our website (www.alshelbycountyfair.com).
- 20) Online Entries for Exhibits required to be checked in by 5 PM, Saturday, September 1, 2018 must be completed by 11:59 PM, Friday, August 31, 2018.
- 21) You must pick up BLANK CARD STOCK or PRE-PRINTED TAGS from locations listed in Rule #10:
- BLANK card stock will be used to print COMPLETE ENTRY TAGS once Online Registration is complete. The system will print a WEB ENTRY NUMBER (WEN) on these tags which will be the identifying number for these entries. The WEN is a 6-digit alphanumeric (Ex. 15A74G, D395Z8, etc.) code. If the WEN does not print on your Entry Tags please contact Michael Letlow at mletlow@alshelbycountyfair.com.
 - Pre-Printed Entry Tags are for Exhibit Registration on manual paper REGISTRATION FORMS. You can use these for ONLINE REGISTRATION if you do not want to print the Entry Tags from the system. Enter the TAG # (4 or 5 digits) at top of the tag in the TAG ID field.
- 22) **JUDGING WILL BE ON A COMPARISON BASIS.** No premium will be awarded if the exhibit was awarded a premium in a previous Shelby County Fair. Please see additional Department specific rules.
- 23) **AWARDS** will be determined by the judges. Ribbons will be affixed to the exhibits and a Judge's Master List will be compiled. The original Judge's Master List will be kept in the Fair Office. Copies of the Judge's Master List will be available at the Kiwanis booth no later than the second day of the Fair. The original Judge's Master List, not the ribbons, will govern the premiums to be paid.
- 24) **EXHIBIT PREMIUMS** of \$10/Class will be paid; 1st Place receives \$5, 2nd Place receives \$3, and 3rd Place receives \$2, unless noted differently in the Special Rules. Best of Show awards are at judge's discretion and will be awarded \$10 in addition to the class premium.
- 25) **BOOTH AND EXHIBIT PREMIUMS** are as follows (1st, 2nd, 3rd, etc.)

- 26) **PREMIUM CHECKS** will be mailed to the address entered on exhibit registration form within 4 weeks after Fair closing. The address used must be the address where the exhibitor, or their parent/guardian, receives personal mail.
- 27) ***Any Premium check that has not cleared the bank within 60 days will be voided.***
- 28) **DEPARTMENT I - LIVESTOCK GENERAL RULES (including CLASS SCHEDULES)** is a separate document and are available on our website or from the Shelby County Extension Office. Premiums are listed under the rules for each show.

DEPARTMENT A ~ FRESH PRODUCE

Rules for Produce:

- A. Small produce must be exhibited in an appropriately sized basket. The basket should be reasonably full, meet quality standards, and be attractively displayed. No Paper type plates.
- B. **No store-bought items are allowed.**
- C. Larger produce such as Apple Gourds, Cabbage, Cantaloupe, Gourds, Hay, Honeydew Melon, Lettuce and Watermelon may be exhibited without a basket and require only a single item.
- D. Hay exhibits must be square bales.
- E. We have divided the YOUTH Departments into 4 age groups. Adult Departments are still 1000 numbers, Ages 4-6 (3000 #s), Ages 7-9 (4000 #s), Ages 10-13 (5000 #s), and Ages 14-18 (6000 #s).
 - a. Examples: **Adult Fresh Fruit = 1101 Ages 4-6 Fresh Fruit = 3101 Ages 7-9 Fresh Fruits = 4101**
Ages 10-13 Fresh Fruits = 5101 Ages 14-18 Fresh Fruits = 6101

DEPARTMENT B ~ CANNED & DRIED FOODS

- A. No Store-bought items are allowed.**
- B. All entries must have been canned or prepared by the person making the entry.**
- C. All entries should have been canned or preserved within the last food preservation season.**
- D. Canned Food entries should be in clean standard canning jars, no larger than quart jars, in good condition with new, 2-piece lids (lid and band).
- E. Dried Food entries should be in closed jars, not necessarily canning jars, no larger than quart size or tightly closed plastic see-through bags.
- F. Oil and Vinegar exhibits shall be in clear longneck bottles and properly sealed.
- G. All containers must be neatly labeled with the name of the product and preservation date (canning, dried, etc.), in month/year format.**
- H. There should be no signs of spoilage, such as gas bubbles, leaky seals, bad odor or cloudy liquid. All jars must be properly sealed.
- I. Any entry that spoils during the fair will be disqualified and prize money will be forfeited.
- J. We have divided the YOUTH Departments into 4 age groups. Adult Departments are still 1000 numbers, Ages 4-6 (3000 #s), Ages 7-9 (4000 #s), Ages 10-13 (5000 #s), and Ages 14-18 (6000 #s).
 - a. Examples: **Adult Canned Fruit = 1201 Ages 4-6 Canned Fruit = 3201 Ages 7-9 Canned Fruits = 4201**
Ages 10-13 Canned Fruits = 5201 Ages 14-18 Canned Fruits = 6201

DEPARTMENT C ~ BAKED GOODS

Rules for Baked Goods Category Classes:

- A. Baked Goods will be accepted on Monday, September 3, 2018 from 8:30 AM to 11:00 AM at the side entrance. To ensure freshness, judging will take place as soon as possible after registration.
- B. Online Registration for Baked Goods will be open until 11:59 PM, Sunday, September 2, 2018.
- C. All entries must be placed on disposable solid material such as foil covered heavy corrugated board or heavy-duty disposable plate.
- D. All Baked Goods exhibits must be made using a recipe. The recipe may include a box mix but must include multiple other ingredients.
- E. The recipe must be attached to the bottom of each entry, preferably typed or printed from a computer program.
- F. Judging will be based on overall appearance and taste.
- G. Bring the entire exhibit (uncut/unsliced) as overall appearance is part of judging criteria.
- H. A minimum of 8 cookies or 8 pieces of candy must be included with each cookie or candy entry.
- I. All entries become the property of the Shelby County Fair and may be disposed of if the entry appears to be spoiled or is otherwise no longer attractive as an Exhibit.
- J. School Culinary Arts Division is Open only to Middle and High School students enrolled in a Culinary Arts or Family and Consumer Science program.
- K. We have divided the YOUTH Departments into 4 age groups. Adult Departments are still 1000 numbers, Ages 4-6 (3000 #s), Ages 7-9 (4000 #s), Ages 10-13 (5000 #s), and Ages 14-18 (6000 #s).
 - a. Examples: **Adult Breads = 1301** **Ages 4-6 Breads = 3301** **Ages 7-9 Breads = 4301**

DEPARTMENT D ~ SEWING

Rules for Sewing Category Classes

- A. All items that cannot be displayed folded or lying flat on a table must be on a hanger covered with a clear plastic bag.

- D. All artwork must be original and done entirely by the artist. Copies of paintings, kits or work that has been previously exhibited in the Shelby County Fair will be disqualified. (Paint by number sets may not be entered.)
- E. The Kiwanis Club reserves the right to refuse any entry or refuse to display an entry due to inappropriate subject matter or non-compliance to these rules.

Youth Division Drawing & Painting:

- A. All artwork must be MATTED, MOUNTED on WHITE POSTER OR MOUNT BOARD, OR FRAMED.
- B. All other Adult Division Drawing & Painting Rules apply to the youth classes.

Rules for Photography Classes:

- A. All photographers are welcome as long as they follow the rules.
- B. All entries must be mounted on **WHITE** mount board or **WHITE** poster board with no more than a 2 inch border.
- C. One picture per mount board or poster board.
- D. Photographs should be no larger than 8" x 10" and may not be framed or under glass.
- E. Names must not appear on the face of the print or mount board.
- F. The Division and Class and the Exhibitor's name must be placed on the back of the mount board.
- G. The Exhibitor must verify that the submitted prints were made within the past 24 months and have not been exhibited in previous Shelby County Fairs. By signing the Registration Form and acknowledging that you have read and complied with the Rules of the Shelby County Fair, you are certifying that the prints comply with this rule.
