Gravel has been spread in front and around the east and west sides of the labyrinth. Trees (6) have been planted. As donations are received, more trees will be placed. We have also planted shrubs and flower bushes and surrounded the area with gravel. Adobe dedication plaques are now in place in the labyrinth courtyard and placement of plaques continue. Theme: Was There No One To Return and Give Thanks?

Although medical science has advanced tremendously, there are still cases where physicians "do not know." This is frightening for patients and relatives involved. Eventually one can adjust to the inevitable. But when there is no certainty as to the diagnosis, the treatment, and final result, one hopes, one prays, one worries. From these cases we can understand how in prescientific times people worried when they had to face diseases. They regarded sickness, epilepsy, leprosy, fever as caused by demons and evil spirits. Hence, they turned to the holy man, the prophet, for help. He was asked to pray and expel the demons. God had to intervene and show his mighty strength. Actually, these people did right away what we do after the doctors have exhausted all their means—they directed themselves to God. It is against this background that we must see the numerous healing narratives in the Bible. Healing stood for expelling evil spirits; hence, it was an apt sign of God being present to his people with his loving care and defeating evil. In reading the healing narratives we should not be more inquisitive than the Biblical authors themselves were. They took those ancient traditions at face value and fashioned them to bring out their religious teachings. Jesus did indeed work miracles but the healing narratives of the Bible are not medical reports. They are stories that convey a religious message, which is God's word to the reader. Understand today's healing narratives with this information in mind!

FIRST READING 2 Kgs 5:14-17 [Gratitude to God]

It is worth our while to read the whole story on Naaman the Syrian in 2 Kings 5. Notice that Naaman was a foreigner, not a member of God's chosen people. This foreigner received salvation and was very grateful. He pledged to worship the God of Israel from that moment on. In line with the opinion of his time, Naaman needs two mule-loads of earth, since the God of the land of Israel can be worshiped only on his own land. Our Lord's comment on this narrative is also noteworthy: "There were many lepers in Israel during the time of Elisha the prophet; yet not one of them was cleansed, but only Naaman the Syrian" (Lk 4:27). The point of this story is clearly that salvation from evil (see Theme) will be given to all. God's salvific will is universal! "The Lord has revealed to the nations his saving power" (Responsorial Psalm). This narrative prepares us to read the Gospel.

SECOND READING 2 Tm 2:8-13 [Life in Christ]

We who are redeemed from evil (First Reading and Gospel) should heed Paul's words to Timothy: "If we have died with him [i.e., died to evil by faith and baptism], we shall also live with him." A Christian life is a sign of gratitude and appreciation for the salvation from evil that God has bestowed upon us.

NEW SAINTS FOR 2025



Bartolo Longo (1841-1926) was an Italian lawyer who converted from Satanism to devout Catholicism. After a powerful spiritual transformation, he became a lay Dominican and dedicated his life to promoting the Rosary and devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. He founded the Shrine of Our Lady of the Rosary in Pompeii and supported schools and charitable works for the poor. Known for his humility and tireless service, he used his gifts to heal the wounds of his past and lead others to Christ. He was beatified in 1980 and is remembered as a champion of the Rosary and mercy.

Carmen Elena Rendiles Martínez (1903-1977) was a Venezuelan nun known for her deep faith and tireless service. Born in Caracas with a missing arm, she wore a prosthetic but never let it hinder her mission. She joined the Servants of the Eucharist in France and later founded the Servants of Jesus of Venezuela in 1965, dedicated to education, healthcare, and parish work. Known for her humility, simplicity, and love of the Eucharist, she inspired many through her example of joyful service. She died in 1977 and was beatified in 2018 in her native Caracas.



Ignatius Shoukrallah Maloyan (1869-1915) was an Armenian Catholic archbishop and martyr. Born in Mardin, Turkey, he became a priest and later Archbishop of Mardin. During the Armenian Genocide, he was arrested with hundreds of his faithful. Refusing to renounce his faith or convert to Islam, he endured torture and was ultimately executed. Before his death, he forgave his persecutors and professed his trust in Christ. His courageous witness inspired many during a time of great persecution. He was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 2001 as a martyr who gave his life for the faith.
