POSITIVE IMAGES BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT

Blvd., the intake house owned by Positive Images, on August 17, to assess what was needed to beautify the residence.

In summary:

- Seven second-floor bedrooms are freshly painted and have twin beds with new sheets, blankets and pillows. Windows have new blinds and sheers. There are new clocks for each room. The old nightstands and dressers that are no longer suitable need to be removed and replaced. Shelves need repairs and the second-floor hall needs to be painted.
- Needed: Decorative, bright-colored wall art on canvas, posters with plastic frame (no glass) to beautify each bedroom.
- The main floor has new blinds & sheers in the two bedrooms, the dining room, living room, and entrance.
- The sink and vanity on the first floor need to be replaced. The vanity in a second-floor bathroom needs to be replaced.
- Closets need hooks and a bar on which to hang clothes.
- Trash baskets are needed for each bedroom.

The <u>Live Your Dream: Education & Training Awards for Women®</u> is now open for applications! And this year's application season marks the 50th anniversary of this life-transforming program. Isn't that exciting?

Since 1972, Soroptimists have distributed more than \$39 million in education grants through the *Live Your Dream Awards* and helped over 39,000 women make a better life for themselves and their families. By empowering women to change their lives, the award has paved the way for new generations of independent, educated, and financially secure women and families, who in turn give back to their communities and countries.

August 1 through November 15 marks the annual award application period, in which eligible women may apply for the award by submitting their application to a club near them (or by applying through the online application portal if located in the U.S. or Canada).

We are pleased to announce that our club can present Soroptimist International of the America's signature educational program, <u>Dream It Be It</u> (DIBI) at <u>Mercy Education Project</u> (MEP), located at 1450 Howard Street in Detroit.

MEP's mission is, "Empowering Women and Girls through Education in Detroit." Sound familiar? A little different wording, but it's the same as our mission! Soroptimist "...provides women and girls access to the education and training they need to achieve economic empowerment."

The program will run from Wednesday, October 12 – November 16, from 3:30-6:30 p.m., with 10-12 high school girls.

During the program two things will be emphasized: Writing and Career Exploration

Writing readiness will be emphasized since the girls need to provide a unique essay to colleges and universities via the "Common Application," which can be sent to almost any college. For U-M, this means it must be done before November 1. The essays will also be useful for girls who are not going to college but need to present a resume to those in charge of certification programs and employers.

We will be asking SIGP members to come speak about their current or past jobs followed by a Q&A. We will also need SIGP members for the de-stress week: chair massage, yoga, journaling, proper nutrition, and sleep, etc. We can carpool to MEP where there's an on-site parking lot.
