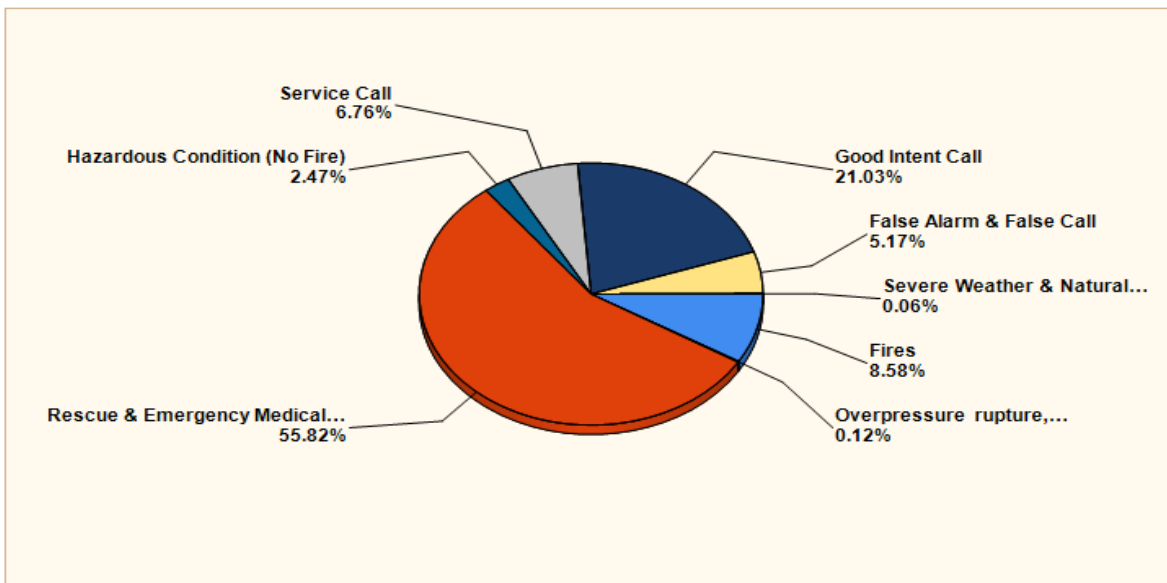
2023 Annual Report



Annual Incident Response

Cumberland Road firefighters provided emergency services response 1702 times, which included fires, EMS/rescue responses, and non-emergency calls for service. Of these responses, Cumberland Road firefighters responded 55 working structures fire. These totals include automatic and mutual aid responses to neighboring departments.

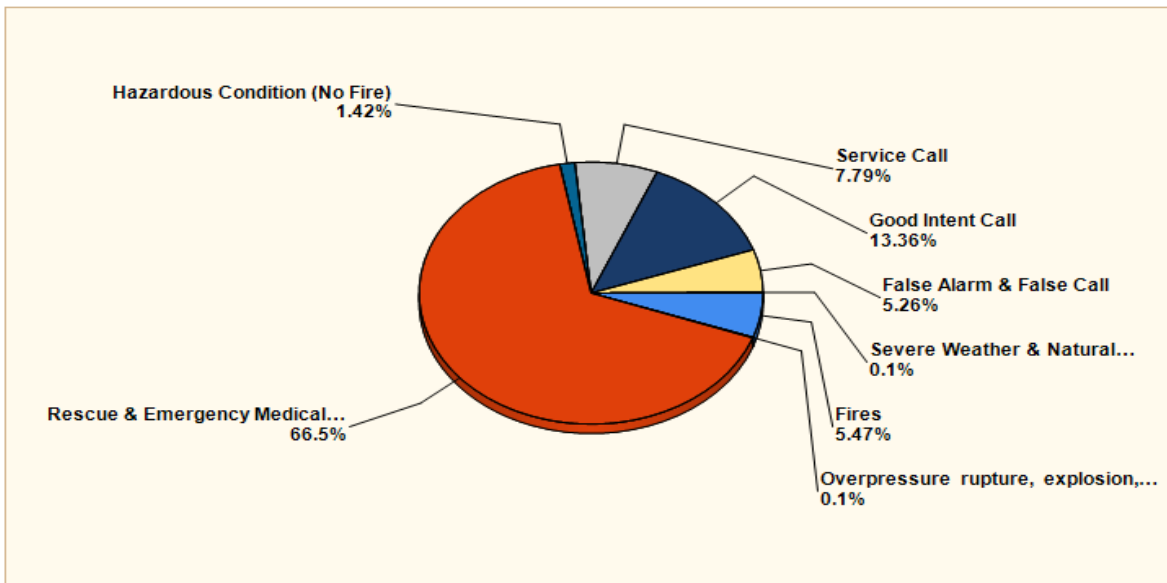

Cumberland Road firefighters provided emergency services response 988 times, within the fire district these incidents included fires, EMS/rescue responses, and non-emergency calls for service.

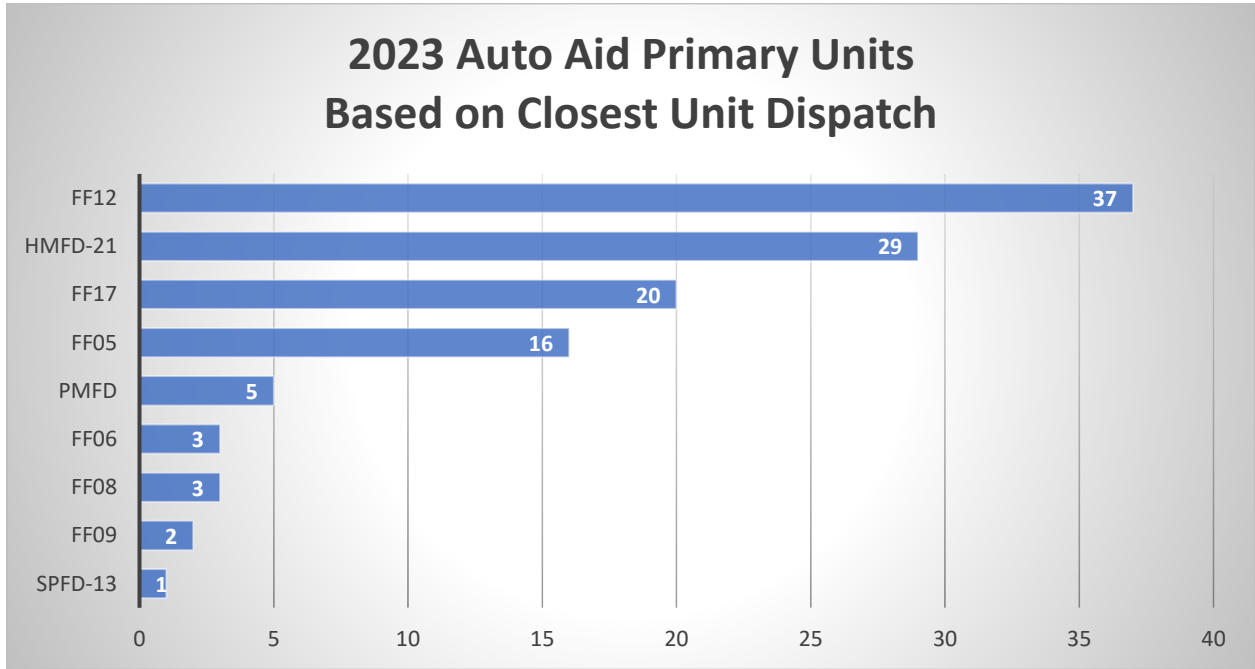

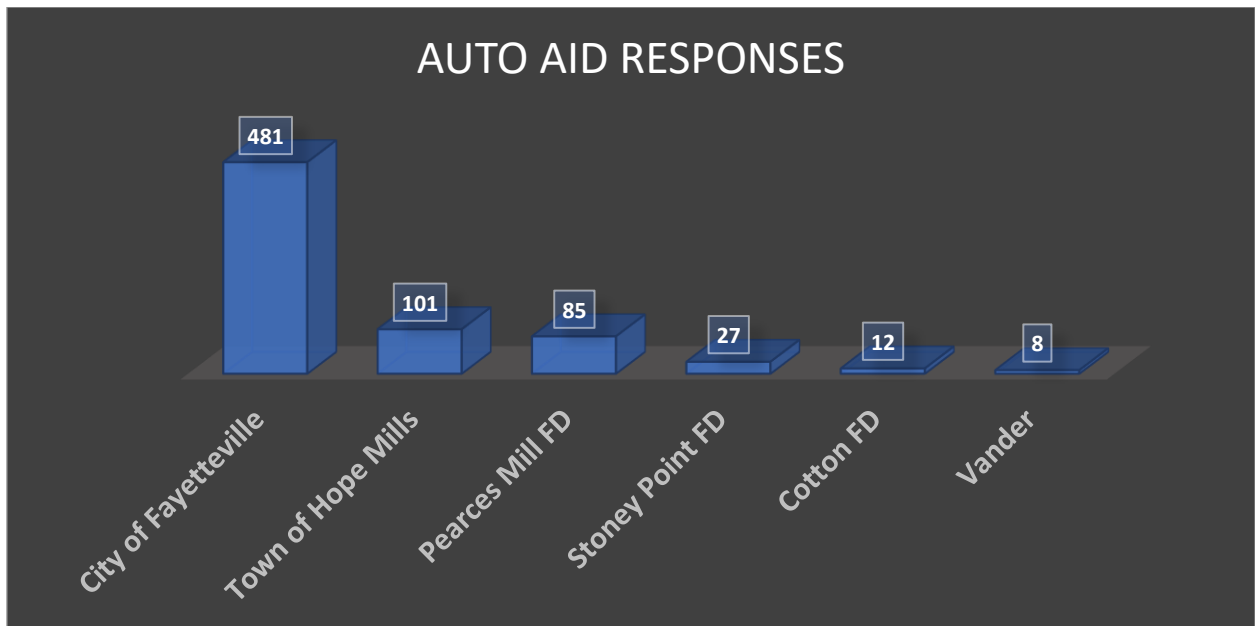
Average Turnout Time (Dispatch to Enroute) for all incidents within the Cumberland Road district was 53 seconds, with an average Response Time (Dispatch to Arrival) was 4 minutes 51 seconds.

Automatic / Mutual Aid

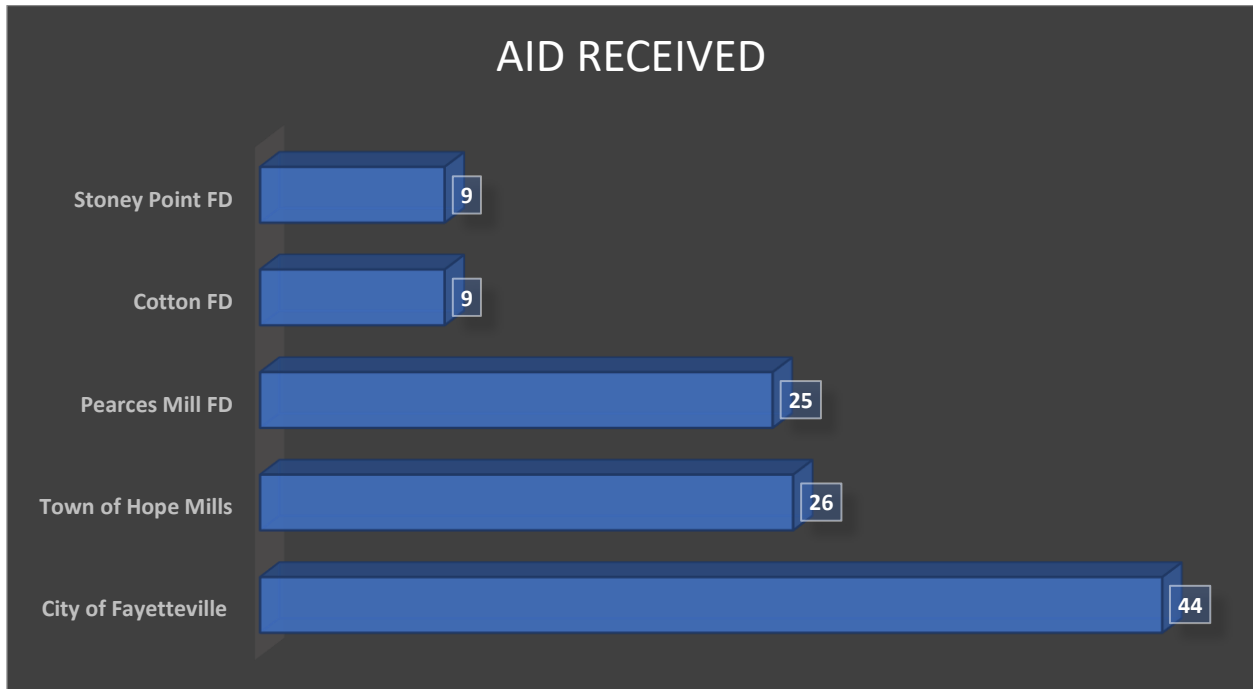
Neighboring departments responded as the Primary unit to 116 of the 1104 calls for service within the Cumberland Road fire district, associated with the Closest Unit Dispatch system.



Cumberland Road Fire Department personnel and units provided Auto Aid to other Fire Agencies in Cumberland County and the City of Fayetteville 714 times.



Neighboring departments responded and arrived on the scene 53 times to assist with incidents located in the Cumberland Road Fire District.



ANNUAL TRAINING

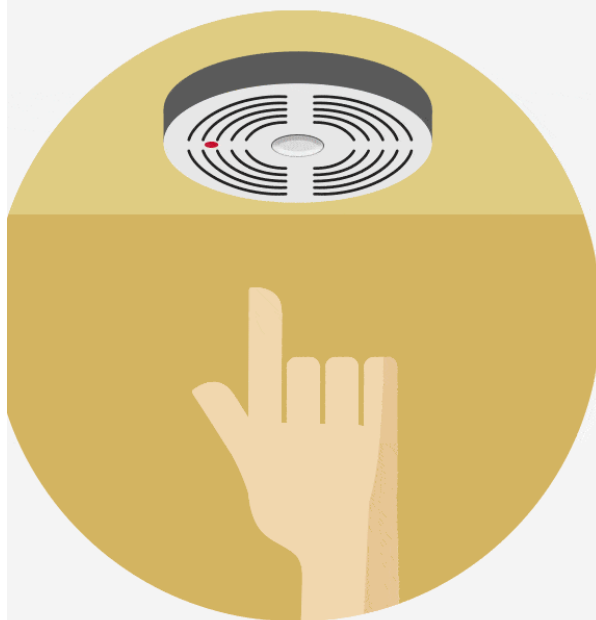
Personnel, both part-time and volunteer members, completed a total of 10,304-man hours of training in 2023.
