On All Saints Day we celebrate the victory won for all the faithful dead, but we grieve for our beloved dead as well, knowing that God honors our tears. We bring our grief to the table and find there a foretaste of Isaiah's feast to come.

Making Lutheran World Relief Mission Quilts and afghans for Laurel House & Genesis Pregnancy Care Center is a tangible way to express love to our neighbors in need. Quilts can be used as warm bedding, simple tents or floor coverings while the afghans provide a level of personal comfort and care. Each one reflects God's loving presence in a world with suffering. Many thanks to everyone who have contributed to this ministry over the past year. If you would like to get involved and be connected to this global Christian family, you are always welcome to join the quilters, knitters, and crocheters of Augustus. The Hearts and Hands Quilting Group meets the first Wednesday and the third Tuesday of each month in room 24 from 9:30 AM to 11:30 AM, and the Hearts and Hands Knitting/Crocheting Group meets the second and fourth Monday night of each month in room 20 from 7:00 PM to 9:00PM. If you prefer to support the Quilting group in the comfort of your own home, we now have quilting packs, each containing 48 squares, available in the Muhlenberg Center: Pick a pack out of the basket on the table, sew the squares into a quilt top, and return the pack to the bin under the table. Each quilt top will then be used to make a quilt for Lutheran World Relief. Each pack has instructions and a contact email address for questions. If you wish to help the Knitting/Crocheting group from the comfort of your own home, 7" x 9" blocks can be either crocheted

or knitted and placed in the designated basket in the Muhlenberg Center. They are also collecting full-sized afghans 49" x 56", and baby afghans 36" x 36" or 36" x 45" in pastel colors. If you need yarn, please contact Mildred Stuffle at jandmstuffle@verizon.net.

In honor of Thankoffering, envelopes will be distributed for your donation in support of the life-changing ministries of the Women of the ELCA including programs, resources, leadership training, and operational expenses. Fifth Bishop of the Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod, Evangelical Lutheran Church in America

The Rev. Patricia Ann Curtis Davenport assumed office as bishop of the Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) on August 1, 2018.

Overwhelmingly elected by the Synod Assembly on May 5, 2018, she is the first African-American woman to be elected a bishop in the 3.8- million-member ELCA. She currently serves as Vice-Chair of the ELCA Conference of Bishops

"Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod is already a great Synod, and our mantra is we can do more together than we can alone," Bishop Davenport says. "I believe I was elected because I lifted up: We can do more, and we can do it together. How do we move from the mentality of 'the church is declining, the church is declining,' to building up the kingdom of God? That's what we're called to do."

Bishop Davenport is leading SEPA Synod in making disciples through information, education and inspiration that leads to transformation. She believes this is the way the Synod makes a difference in the five-county area she is called to serve.

At the time of her election, Bishop Davenport served the Synod as Director for Evangelical Mission and Assistant to the Bishop, with responsibilities for new and redeveloping congregations, congregational vitality, and urban ministries.

Bishop Davenport is a member of Spirit and Truth Worship Center, Yeadon, which she served as its founding pastor/developer. She received the master of divinity degree from the former Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia, now United Lutheran Seminary. 
