He left It was a small, albeit momentary, taste of being his church because he began to realize that to fulfill God's Kingdom work, people needed to learn WAY IT IS SUPPOSE TO BE!! to use their gifts and work with other people, united for the cause of Christ. People needed to begin to embrace and own the challenge in John 17. Jesus says this:

"My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in Me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in Me and I am in You. May they also be in Us so that the world may believe that you have sent Me. I have given them the glory that you gave Me, that they may be one as We are one—I in them and you in Me—so that they may be brought to complete unity. Then the world will know that you sent Me and have loved them even as You have loved Me."

I am often saddened by the lack of unity among the churches in Yreka. There is such a spirit of territoriality that causes us to fear connection. Rather than striving to be the Body of Christ collectively, we settle for doing our own thing often with a competitive attitude that leads to pride in what we are doing and what they are not. That's crazy thinking and exactly what Satan wants! We have been doing that for years right here where we live with our own UM sister churches! That's crazy thinking and exactly what Satan wants! What do the UM churches in our area have to **Un-**learn in order to do the work of ministry on behalf of our God, United Methodist Connection, and the call to be the church in the world where we have been planted. Are the needs of the people and the conditions of their souls really that different in Montague, in Yreka and in Mt. Shasta? I don't think so.

What a testimony it would be if the United Methodist Churches in our area could truly unite under one mission, demonstrating ministry and outreach proactively and collectively beyond the walls of

choirs? Maybe a collective VBS in a park somewhere in each community is possible? Maybe the pastor's exchange pulpits so that each church could get to know each of us. Maybe we worship together quarterly and celebrate our unity. Maybe there is much for us to **UN-**learn first? What are we willing to let go of and give up in order to see the Gospel of Good News shared as one church rather than three? I think God would be pleased with us! I believe that God would smile on us and give us favor if we could get to the place where together we work for a common mission. I invite you to pray with me about this and see if we might be a catalyst for unity.



Bishop Minerva G. Carcaño

Minerva Garza Carcaño was born in Edinburg, Texas. She did her undergraduate work at the University of Texas at Pan American, and then earned her Masters of Theology at Perkins School of Theology. Ordained in 1976 she has served congregations in Texas, New Mexico and California. In 1986, she became the first Hispanic woman to be appointed a United Methodist district superintendent in the continental United States serving in West Texas and New Mexico. She was then appointed the lead pastor of the South Albuquerque Cooperative Parish Ministry from 1992 to 1996. From 1996 to 2001, she served as the Director of the Mexican American program Perkins School of Theology. In 2001, she assumed the appointment of Dis-

trict Superintendent to the greater Portland, Oregon area in the Oregon-Idaho Conference.

On a national level, she has served on the former General Board of Education, the General Boards of Global Ministry and Church and Society, and the United Methodist Publishing House. She both served on and chaired the National Cooperative Parish Ministry Leadership Team of the UMC, and was the lead clergy delegate to both the 1996 and 2004 General Conferences. She has a long history of committed involvement in ministries with immigrants and refugees, the poor and US/Mexico border communities. She has encouraged and led congregations to be active in community organizing and to work ecumenically believing that communities hold the experience and wisdom to create a world of justice and peace if they will but come together.

Minerva serves on the Board of the General Commission on Christian Unity and Interreligious Concerns, the National Plan for Hispanic and Latino Ministries and the General Conference Study Committee on the Relationship Between The United Methodist Church and the Churches of Latin America and the Caribbean.

Minerva Garza Carcaño was elected to the episcopacy in 2004 by the Western Jurisdictional Conference of the United Methodist Church, the first Hispanic female ever elected bishop. She was assigned to the Phoenix Area on September 1, 2004. After 8 years, she was assigned to the Los Angeles Area in 2012.

Minerva is married to Thomas Spaniolo, an immigration lawyer, and they are the parents of a teen-aged daughter, Sofia.






selfless act, with an IMPACT of freedom and power to humble our souls, a reminder to keep our eyes focused on the Father.
