ANNEX CONTEMPORARY DANCE COMPANY

Annex Contemporary Dance Company is the resident professional dance company of The Dance Annex Studio in York, Maine. Founded in 2015, ACDC is proud to engage some of the finest movement artists in the Seacoast area, and aims to bring impactful, professional work to local audiences, building community through education and outreach. In addition to evening-length works, the company performs in The Dance Annex's annual production of *The Nutcracker*, which is now heading into its ninth season and has become a Seacoast holiday tradition. ACDC has toured throughout New England, and has collaborated with many local and visiting artists and musicians from New England, New York City, and beyond.

With the launch of *Now, New, Next*, ACDC celebrates its ongoing mission to build, sustain, and support our vibrant local dance community. This dynamic program features repertory favorites from ACDC director Julie Hebb, a brand-new original work by guest choreographer Kelsie Steil entitled *Gateways*, and *Right On*—an energetic ensemble piece set on the company by guest choreographers Christine Jacques and Patricia Harms, co-directors of Range of Motion Arts. A special Q&A with the choreographers and dancers will follow each performance. We are thrilled to share this exciting new event with you and introduce our guest choreographers. Thank you for being here for what's now, what's new, and what's next!

NOW, NEW, NEXT Guest Choreographers

Kelsie Steil is a freelance choreographer living in Biddeford, Maine. She earned a Bachelors Degree in Adventure Education with a Minor in Dance from Plymouth State University, and graduated with the 2018 Contemporary Dance Ensemble award for her achievements in Choreography. Her portfolio comprises both live performance and dance film and has been described as cerebral, visceral, and heavily theatrical. Her projects are strong in collaboration, working with artists across all mediums. Her collaborations include MR. MIND, a dance film created alongside filmmaker and photographer Maxwell Auger, and CRAVING THE MYSTIC, a stage work adapted into an award-winning film by filmmaker Jennifer Hoffer. Kelsie has worked with music composers Michael Wall and Masha Reznik in the creation of original scores to accompany her choreographies. Kelsie operates as a concept-driven dance maker, with deep research as a large part of the early development of a new work. Much of her work is rooted in mental health and trauma and typically starts from building a character profile based on those experiences. Rummage Lane, a full-length dance-theatre duet choreographed with Hannah Haines, is an example of a piece centered around mental health through relationships with familial objects. Kelsie is driven by the moments where movement

and message clash and is very interested in demonstrating dissonance and a sense of unreality in the choreography she creates. When working with dancers, her first aim is creating a safe, accepting and communicative environment. Channeling her background as an experiential educator, she often begins a process through deep discussion, joyful group initiatives and character work linked to the concept of the work. Kelsie most recently produced Split My Soul, which premiered at Biddeford's historical City Theater. Split My Soul is an evening-length dance-theater work centered around mental health through the lens of seven distinct characters, and can now be watched online by visiting kelsiesteilmovement.com/splitmysoul.

Patricia (Trish) Harms, Co-Director of Range of Motion Arts, has a BFA in dance from NYU Tisch School of the Arts. She is a member of the National Dance Education Organization, a Registered Dance Educator, and has two New Hampshire teaching endorsements, Dance and Theatre. In 1990 Patricia conceived Triad Dance Ensemble and co-directed, choreographed, and performed with the company through 1996. She has been an artist-inresidence in the public schools, and for two decades, directed the Dance Program at Pinkerton Academy in Derry, New Hampshire. During those 20 years she developed five courses, including Unified Dance and Unified Theatre using a peer mentorship model for students with special needs, as well as Dance 2/Company, a course that immersed students in all aspects of concert production: creating choreography, learning peer and professional choreography, costume and lighting design, publicity, and more. For 12 years she participated in Bates Dance Festival's intensive professional training program. There she worked with internationally recognized leaders in the field of dance, expanding her knowledge in a range of dance forms, as well as exploring innovative approaches to choreography and pedagogy. Patricia enjoys collaborating with like-minded visual artists, musicians, and fellow choreographers. She has created work with Carol Dilley, former Director of Dance at Bates College and continues to create work with Range of Motion Arts Co-Director Christine Jacques. She remains active in the New England dance community, sharing her love of dance in a variety of settings.

Christine Jacques, Co-Director of Range of Motion Arts, has an extensive background as a performing artist, dance educator, choreographer, and arts facilitator. She was a full scholarship recipient at the University of Utah, training in their prestigious ballet program and later furthering her studies in modern dance. She has participated in the Utah

Choreographer's Project, the American Dance Festival West and the Bates Dance Festival. She toured both regionally and nationally with Indianapolis Ballet Theatre, Oregon Ballet Theatre, Ballet West and modern dance company Dance Kaleidoscope, dancing major roles in classical ballets as well as performing in a wide range of modern and contemporary works. Christine has taught ballet, contemporary modern dance, jazz dance, and creative dance throughout northern New England. She was Assistant Artistic Director of Portsmouth, New Hampshire's Ballet Theatre Workshop and has been a guest choreographer at Berwick Academy, Philip's Exeter Academy and Pinkerton Academy. Christine founded and directed Elysium Dance Project, where she developed dance and yoga programming in a noncompetitive, inclusive environment. Having an interest in the therapeutic value of the arts, she earned a degree in Movement Therapy that culminated in a workshop series for teens integrating dance and collage-making. She went on to work as a dance and integrated arts specialist for adults with disabilities. Christine continues to enjoy collaborating with artists in a range of disciplines and making work with Patricia Harms, Co-Director of Range Of Motion Arts.

Julie Hebb (ACDC Artistic Director) brings with her decades of experience performing, teaching, choreographing, and staging original ballet, modern, jazz, and contemporary works in New York City, the greater Boston area, and northern New England. With her deep foundation in various ballet techniques, predominantly the Russian Vaganova style, along with her wide experiences in contemporary training that includes Paul Taylor, Lester Horton, Rebecca Kelly, Jennifer Muller, and others, she brings to The Dance Annex a relevance in training that is essential for today's dancers.

Ms. Hebb received her training at Boston Ballet, Hartford Ballet, Ballet Theater of Boston, STEPS, Marjorie Mussman, Madame Gabriela Darvash, City Center Studios, Peridance, and the Paul Taylor School. She moved from Boston to New York City where she taught and performed principal roles with Rebecca Kelly Ballet from 1992-2006, and was ballet mistress for the company and assistant to the director for choreography, workshops, and summer programs. Ms. Hebb performed as guest artist for North Country Ballet Ensemble, Impulse Dance Company and North Atlantic Ballet of Boston, MA; Several Dancers Core of Atlanta, GA; and other ballet, modern, and musical theater companies throughout the Northeast. In New York, Ms. Hebb taught at STEPS NYC, Joffrey Ballet School, Berest Dance Studio, Garden City Community Dance Project, and Rebecca Kelly Ballet. She holds a Bachelor of Science degree in a combined major of Psychology and Exercise Science from Brooklyn

College. After returning to New England, she began teaching at studios in and around New Hampshire and Maine.

Ms. Hebb founded The Dance Annex in Kittery in the Fall of 2012 and has built a community of dancers and dance enthusiasts in Southern Maine and beyond for more than ten years. She established Annex Contemporary Dance Company in 2015 to provide opportunities for local professionals to perform and flourish, to create new works, and to bring professional dance productions to the area. In addition to evening length performances and its annual production of The Nutcracker, ACDC tours throughout New England, and has collaborated with many local and visiting artists and musicians from New England, New York City, and beyond.

ACDC ARTIST BIOGRAPHIES

Cara Burke is a New Hampshire native. She grew up dancing with Sole City Dance and New England Dance Project. She performed competitively and in community benefits in both southern NH & ME. After high school, she joined Boston Dance Theater's trainee program, where she graduated in April 2022 under Artistic Directors Jessie Jeanne Stinnett and Itzik Galili. With BDT she performed in works by Junichi Fukuda, Isvel Bello, and Maleek Washington. Cara has attended summer intensives at University of New Hampshire, Joffrey's New York City Jazz & Contemporary program, and Sarasota Contemporary Dance. In Spring of 2022 she joined Ballet Bloom to perform in Rose Hutchin's Four Seasons project in Portland, ME. In Summer of 2022 Cara joined Lira Dance Theatre in Sioux Falls, South Dakota and performed as a member of their 8th season. Most recently Cara learned Argentine Tango from Alejandro Figliolo and performed in LILA Dance Festival 2024.

Jacqui DeFrança is a Maine-based dance artist originally from Massachusetts. She is a graduate from Loyola Marymount University Los Angeles where she received a B.A. in Dance. She has had the pleasure of performing at venues such as: Ailey Citigroup Theater, St. Mark's Church, Joe's Pub, Milk Studios, Dixon Place, Lightbox, Engine and SPACE Gallery. Jacqui has also danced at various showcases including: ACDF, Western Arts Alliance Annual Conference, Reverb Dance Festival, APAP, and CFDA/Vogue presentation. As well as stage, she has experience with TV and Film, dancing in Video Music Awards performance with Rihanna, Oh Land's music video Renaissance Girls and acting and dancing in the short

films Out of Zinc and Big Breakin'. Learning under artistic director Mike Esperanza, Jacqui was a member of Bare Dance Company from 2008-2015. She also has worked with New York City based, Flying Under The Radar (FUTR) with artistic director Marlon Taylor-Wiles since 2014. Alongside performing, Jacqui enjoys choreographing and has had the delight in creating movement for Illesteva's fashion week presentation 2012, KOPPS's music video Hottin 2018, The Bones of J.R.Jones' music video Stay Wild in 2020 and continuously developing solo improvisation work. While dancing in Maine, Jacqui has had the honor of working with Subcircle, Michael Figueroa, Scott McPheeters, Liz Mulkey, Rose Hutchins, Kelsie Steil, Hannah Haines, Alison Chase and Ali Kenner Brodsky. She has been performing and training with contemporary ballet company Ballet Bloom Project since 2020. Jacqui also curated and performed in En Route, a two month curbside performance series at Engine in 2021 and co-curated the series second show in 2022. She is currently involved in project based work both in film and live performance.

Audrey Eastman began her dance training when she was young at Holly Jane Dance Center with Holly Jane Johnson. In high school, she pursued more advanced training at Great Bay Academy of Dance with Elisa Gerasin and Kristen Samson in Kittery, ME. She graduated Magna Cum Laude from the University of New Hampshire in 2020 with a BS in Biomedical Science (Medical/Veterinary Sciences) and a BA in Dance. In December of 2023 she graduated as a Doctor of Physical Therapy from Tufts University School of Medicine. Audrey is currently a licensed physical therapist in both New Hampshire and Massachusetts. While at UNH she trained with Assaf Benchetrit and Susan Endrizzi and performed with the UNH Dance Company. She has attended summer programs with the American Ballet Theatre and the University of Utah. In January of 2019, she traveled to Buenos Aires with DanceAbroad Argentina and trained in ballet and contemporary with various Argentinian teachers. She has had the privilege to perform Sugar Plum Fairy and Snow Queen in GBAD's "An 1836" Portsmouth Nutcracker," Cinderella with the UNH Dance Company, original choreographed works at Lila Dance Festival, and in City Ballet of Boston's "Urban Nutcracker." She is currently performing with Annex Contemporary Dance Company directed by Julie Hebb, as well as various local schools.

Sarah Flaherty trained and performed with Derry Dance Center from age 5 through 18 in Derry, NH. She continued with ballet classes at UNH while earning a B.A. in English. Following college, she studied ballet and contemporary at Portsmouth School of Ballet before

taking a lengthy dance break as she grew her career and started a family. Sarah now spends her days leading an amazing team of learning experience designers at the IAPP. Angela has recently studied under Rhonda Malkin in NYC for precision dance. Angela is the proud co-owner of Corinne's School of Dance in Rochester, NH and loves teaching all styles of dance. In 2017, Angela founded CSD Ballet Company and directed her first ballet, The Sleeping Beauty. She has since directed Alice In Wonderland and The Wizard of OZ.

Hannah Haines is a dancer, choreographer and educator based in Southern Maine. She graduated Summa Cum Laude with a BA in Anthropology, and Dance with a concentration in performance and choreography from Skidmore College in May 2019. While at Skidmore Hannah had the opportunity to perform works by Skidmore Faculty, and repertory by Earl

Mosley, Ohad Naharin, Paul Taylor, Danny Grossman, and Isadora Duncan. She has studied as an Apprentice with Lori Belilove and the Isadora Duncan Dance Company, and performed as a freelance artist with with Ballet Bloom Project under the direction of Rose Hutchens, and in works by Holly Stone, Amanda Whitworth, and Kelsie Steil. Hannah has presented her own choreography in film and live performances at numerous venues including Space Gallery, Engine Gallery, and the American Dance Festival's Movies by Movers film festival. Hannah teaches ballet, modern dance, and yoga throughout Southern Maine. She is currently the director of Biddeford Movement Map—a collection of virtual and live movement-based events and offerings that explore the history and development of Biddeford, ME. Elyssa Moyer started her training at the age of six at The Robertson's School of Classical Ballet with Larry and Colleen Robertson. She continued her training at various schools in the seacoast area with teachers such as Susan Duffy, Christine Simes, Elisa Gerasin, Edra Toth, and John Ling. She has attended summer intensive programs at Festival Ballet Providence, Jose Mateo Ballet Theatre, and Burklyn Ballet Theatre where she was one of few chosen to perform in Aladdin at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival in Scotland. She has danced professionally with companies; Northeastern Ballet Theatre, Boston Dance Company, Carolina Ballet Theatre, SundanceX, and is a current company member with Annex Contemporary Dance Company. Elyssa continues to perform as a guest artist with companies and schools across New England. She is assistant director of DanceAbroad Argentina, a study abroad program that allows dancers to immerse themselves in the vibrant culture of Argentina, studying Spanish, mastering the art of tango, and delving into the country's rich history. Elyssa co-founded the LILA Dance Festival which has since blossomed into LILA Productions a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization with a mission to foster genuine appreciation for dance in New Hampshire.

Nathan Moyer was born in Concord, New Hampshire. He began his dance training at Colby-Sawyer College at the age of 18. In his sophomore year, Nathan went to Paris with Wells College for the Arts. While at UNH, Nathan studied ballet with Larry Robertson and Ballet New England director David Drummond. Nathan graduated from the University of New Hampshire in 2005 with a bachelor degree in theater and dance. Nathan performed with Ballet New England as a company member in 2005 and

2006. In the summer of 2006, Nathan furthered his training at the Joffrey Ballet School in New York City. In late 2006, Nathan moved to Buenos Aires, Argentina to widen his understanding and expand his training in dance. While living in Buenos Aires, Nathan studied with Maria Chichi Diaz, and he was accepted into the Teatro Colon's Men's ballet program. In April 2007, Nathan founded DanceAbroad Argentina, a groundbreaking study abroad program designed to provide dancers with immersive experiences in Argentine culture and dance. Today, Nathan dedicates his time to performing and teaching as a guest artist in New Hampshire, the New England region, and Argentina, sharing his passion for dance and nurturing the next generation of dancers. He is a company member of Annex Contemporary Dance Company, and is the co-founder of the Lila Dance Festival and LILA Productions, an organization that is dedicated to bringing quality professional dance and engaging new audiences in New Hampshire and the region.

Lily Neher began dancing in Saratoga Springs, NY, studying ballet and modern dance at Saratoga City Ballet, and performing with Nacre Dance Group. She has attended programs at the Joffrey Ballet School and Steps. Lily is a graduate of UNH where she received a B.A. in dance and a B.A. in Communication as well as a Masters of Businesses Administration. There, she danced with the UNH Ballet company, freelanced around the Seacoast, and studied aerial silks. She danced in several works at Lila Dance Festival in summer 2022 and 2023. Recently, she spent her summer in Singapore and took classes at the Singapore National Ballet and One Dance Asia. Lily is excited to return to the area and dance with Dance Annex!

Emily Pleadwell grew up in Buffalo, NY where she trained with the American Academy of Ballet under director Maris Battaglia. In 2018, Lorelei was a principal dancer in "Vanity Lane," a production of Harvard University's BlackCAST Productions. Lorelei is also a seamstress and an aerialist, specializing in Aerial Tissu in which she has been training since 2008. She has recently started competing in the Aerial Arts, receiving a Second-Place award in 2019 and a First Place award in 2020, both in the Advanced category of the National Aerialympics Competition.
