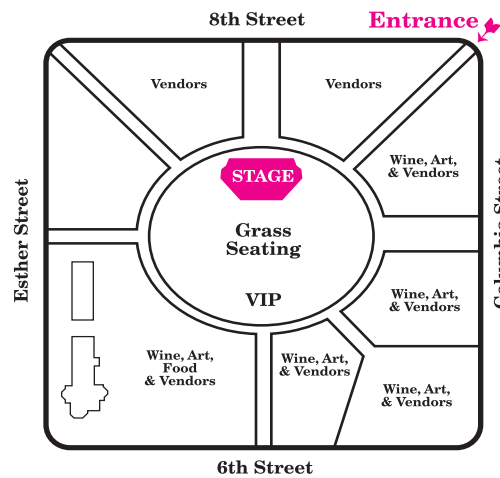

- From Seattle:** I-5 South to Mill Plain Blvd/City Center Exit 1C
- Turn right on Mill Plain • Go 5 lights • Left on Columbia to 8th St.

Parking
