A Blind Man Asks to See

Before you read:

Activate Prior Knowledge

- a) What is your favorite thing to look at?
- b) What would your life be like if you couldn't see that thing or person?
- c) If you became blind, what would you miss seeing the most?

After you read:

Spin and Pray

Go outside. Take turns spinning around with eyes closed while you say this prayer: "Lord, thank you for my eyes that see. Thank you, Lord, for the beauty. Thank you for letting me see... Open your eyes and thank God for the first thing you see.

I Want to See You, Lord

What must it have been like for Bartimaeus when he first opened his blinded eyes and beheld the beautiful, smiling face of Jesus shining upon him with pure love? We can't see Jesus like that right now. It is like we are blind, in the dark. Do you want to see Jesus? Ask him with this song:



What do YOU Want?

Look back in the story. On the illustrated title page, draw word bubbles and write in the conversation between Jesus and Bartimaeus. Now, write in new word bubbles dialogue you might have with Jesus. Use a different color of pen. What do you want Jesus to do for you? Ask him and have faith that he can do it and that he will do it according to God's best plan for you. You can also ask for more faith to believe. Jesus loves those kinds of prayers. Ask, beg, believe, receive.

Roadblocks to Miracles

What stopped Bartimaeus from getting to Jesus, from falling on his knees and begging for a miracle? NOTHING! Not darkness, not a crowd, not negative people, not even his heavy cloak. He cast it off; he ignored those who told him to be quiet. Bartimaeus did everything he could and at the same time begged for the mercy of God. And he got his miracle! Draw the above roadblocks along the road and label them on the right side. Then write on the left side of the road what might be stopping YOU from begging Jesus for a miracle.
