We're on the Road

Not only are we on the Road to Damascus (Acts 9:1-19), but it looks like we've nearly reached De-Mask-Us.

On Thursday, May 13 the Center for Disease Control (CDC) announced that "fully vaccinated people no longer need to wear a mask or physically distance in any setting, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance."

What does this mean for Aledo UMC? Fortunately, we've gotten some clarification from Curtis Brown in our Conference office who posted, "This means that fully vaccinated people will not need to wear a face mask or physically distance in most of our churches during worship services, gatherings, and meetings, including while speaking and singing."

A fully vaccinated person is one who is two weeks past receiving a full dose of vaccine. Unvaccinated people will still need to wear masks in larger, multiple-household gatherings such as most church activities.

We will not require the wearing of masks during worship at Aledo UMC. We are going to operate on trust, however, so we will not be asking anyone if they have been fully vaccinated. If you come to church without a mask, we are not going to ask questions.

I would suggest that worshippers bring masks with them and keep one handy because not everyone who worships with us will have been vaccinated. For example, the vaccine was only made available to youths aged 12 and up on Monday, May 10. If they get one of the two-dose vaccines, the earliest they would be fully vaccinated will not be until June 21. Also, the vaccine is not yet available to children between ages 2 to 12, and probably won't be until fall.

Vacation Bible School begins Monday, July 19 and that means teachers, workers, and children should wear a mask. The same is true of our children's Sunday school ministry which we plan to re-

There may also be some worshippers who either prefer not getting the vaccine, or who are not yet fully vaccinated. As Curtis Brown writes, "some fully vaccinated people may wish to continue to wear masks out of an abundance of caution or in solidarity with children and other people who are not able to be vaccinated." All who worship with us should feel welcome, safe, and comfortable whether or not they are wearing a mask. We certainly do not want to create an environment of insiders and outsiders. One change you will notice is that the bows which color-coded the pews have been removed. This was done because Covid-19 is primarily through respiratory droplets, rather than surface contact. Also, as we have been allowed to increase the number of people who gather for worship, some of our pews were getting quite crowded, especially our 10:30 "blue pews." Removing the bows will allow worshippers to spread out more evenly throughout the sanctuary.




FLAG DAY

In the United States, Flag Day is celebrated on June 14th (a Monday this year). It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States, which happened that day, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress, in 1777. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that officially established June 14 as Flag Day; in August 1949, National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress. Flag Day is not an official federal holiday, though on June 14, 1937, Pennsylvania became the first (and only) U.S. state to celebrate Flag Day as a state holiday. The longest-running Flag Day parade is held annually in Quincy, Massachusetts, which began 1952 and will celebrate its 69th year in 2021. The largest Flag Day parade is held annually in Troy, New York, which bases its parade on the Quincy parade and typically draws 50,000 spectators. The week of June 14 is designated as "National Flag Week." During Na-



tional Flag Week, the president will issue a proclamation urging U.S. citizens to fly the American flag for the duration of that week. This year, remember the freedom that our flag represents, and thank God for that freedom- including the freedom to worship.

What Will Our New Normal Look Like?

With the recent announcement from the CDC allowing larger groups to meet with fewer masks, we can finally begin to visualize our "New Normal" at Aledo UMC.

New Pastor (ME). First, we need to remember that we haven't been in true normal since sometime before Rev. Mark's illness. That's not to take anything away from Pastor Dan Wright; I've known Dan for many years and we've spent many hours together in fellowship and prayer around a pot of coffee. Dan was appointed to Aledo for a specific reason and for a specific time, and he fulfilled his mission with excellence. He also rose to the challenge of pastoring this church as a pandemic set in. I am greatly indebted to Dan for his leadership in this congregation through some difficult days.

As we stand on the brink of our New Normal, please bear in mind that there is a new pastor in Aledo. I have not had the privilege of experiencing this church in anything but a pandemic. Plus, as any pastor would, I will continue to bring my own style to the church, so please continue to be patient with me.

SOCIAL MINISTRY. One of the many things we learned over the past fourteen months is the importance of broadcasting our services on Facebook Live and on WRMJ. We may be near the end of the pandemic, but our presence on social media will remain. In fact, I hope to expand it even further. We must be mindful of those persons who are reluctant to enter a church building or who live far away or who are unable to come to church.

SUMMER OF TRANSITION. I envision this summer as a time of transition to our New Normal. That means our services may look a bit different in June. They may look a bit different again in July and August and yet again in September. I don't want our worship experiences to be predictable. However, both our Connection praise band and our Forgiven "rocking for Jesus" band will be back in similar formats in order to connect you with Jesus Christ. One or both may be back as soon as Sunday, May 30.

One of the first changes I see is that sometime this summer we will shift our Sunday Facebook Live services to the 8 am service. We'll also record our WRMJ services at that time. This is necessary for a variety of reasons. Some of the music that we present at 9:15 am cannot be streamed live on Facebook. But most importantly, this September we plan to re-launch our children's Sunday school ministry, and Kathleen Bashem will be busy with that program. However, it is important for Kathleen to have a presence on our Facebook livestream as well as our radio broadcasts and she can best do that at 8 am. Her "Children's Moment" will be a part of all services this summer until Sunday school begins this fall. As always, children are welcome at all services.

<u>Christmas In July.</u> We were not able to hold in-person worship this past Christmas Eve, so one of the special events we will be holding is "Christmas in July" on Sunday morning, July 18. That means get out your Christmas sweaters and come to church ready to sing lots of Christmas carols.

<u>Offerings</u>. One of the changes we made during the pandemic is placing offering plates at the entrances rather than passing them during the service. Since we're on a rather tight worship schedule, we may continue to continue that practice in our New Normal. One of the reasons we can take that risk is because you've been so faithful in supporting the church over these past fourteen months. Thank you!

<u>Pastoral Care.</u> Our New Normal should mean that I will be able to make hospital and nursing home calls which I generally was not able to do during the pandemic. Years ago, hospitals were diligent about contacting pastors when their parishioners were in the hospital. That is no longer the case, so if you or a loved one is in need of pastoral care, please call or text me at 309-798-9080, or call the church office at 309-582-2169.
