

Show off Flawless skin

Spring has arrived and mammals shed their winter coat as do humans, revealing more skin. It's time to examine the exposed face, neck and décolleté. These areas often reveal a woman's true beauty, uniqueness and age. When looking closely in the mirror, one may see a change in texture of their skin; uneven tone, small lumps, bumps or patchy rough spots. There may be new imperfections, remnants of last summer's sun damage; brown spots and tiny red blood vessels. You may notice raised skin lesions; milia, a tiny hard pearl-like blemish made of keratin, sebum and dead skin cells that you can't extract, blood spots (ruby points) or enlarged skin pores that continually trap debris. Bothersome skin tags often grow in the creases of the neck, underarms and likewise under the breasts.

Various types of skin blemishes are mostly vascular and can easily be treated to achieve a smoother complexion without the risk of scarring or leaving a large indentation in the skin after removal. As far back as the early 1900's electrolysis was being used for treatment of port-wine marks, broken capillaries on the cheeks and nose or even yellow pigmented spots or plates found on the eyelids. Today's modern technology offers safe and comfortable treatments with permanent results at an affordable price (\$35 per 15 min. session). A professional Electrologist can assess the blemish and advise if you are a candidate for this non-invasive treatment. However if medical conditions are a concern, it is always recommended to speak with your physician prior to any cosmetic skin treatment.

This Advance Cosmetic Procedure applies a sterile filament (the size of an eyelash) directly on top of the vascular blemish. Minute currents of high frequency are delivered to cauterize the blood vessels that feed the blemish. When treating tiny tread veins, capillaries or blood spots typically found on the nose, cheeks or neck area, the current transforms the blood into solid matter making it

invisible on the surface of the skin. Many vascular blemishes disappear on contact. The body then absorbs and redirects the blood flow to other capillaries in the deeper layers of the skin. Skin tags are treated similarly in that their base or neck is cauterized cutting off the blood supply leaving it to dry up and fall off in a few days following treatment. It is important to properly cauterize a skin tag to prevent continuous bleeding or infection. Sun/age spots, plugged pores and milia which lie superficially or under the surface of the skin can easily be treated with ACP techniques. The current will dissolve the debris and the body will absorb and heal the blemish within days. New skin will form where the blemish once was and heal without a trace. Sun protection is imperative as new skin formation is vulnerable to UV rays.
