OBITUARY



Naomi Doris McKinnis was born in Wildwood, FL, on August 20, 1933, to the union of William H. and Annie Sarah Jane Fluiette. She was the youngest of nine children and all her brothers and sisters preceded her in death. Naomi attended J. R. E. Lee Elementary and High Schools, graduating as class Valedictorian. She went on to attend Florida A&M University, where she majored in Pre-Med. She was also a highly skilled athlete receiving scholarships to attend college.

While living in Tampa, FL, Naomi met and married Gread McKinnis and to that union was born six children; Annette, Yvonne, Sharron, Gread Jr., John, and Michael.

After relocating to Chicago, Naomi began working in the Insurance industry. She started her career at Mack and Parker Insurance Agency, where she was one of its first African American employees. She spent over thirty years at Mass Insurance Consultants and Administrators, where she held many positions, retiring as Director of Claims Auditing.

Upon accepting Christ as her Savior, Naomi joined and served at various churches including New Mount Olive Missionary Baptist Church, and Christ Bible Center Church. At the time of her passing she had been a member of Vernon Park Church of God for thirty four years. There she served as Trustee, Deaconess, Mission Worker, and Sunday School teacher. Her fondest and most cherished memories were working alongside Sister Sarah Walker, serving the homeless.

In addition to her church work, Naomi co-founded the Gread "Lefty" McKinnis Memorial Foundation, in honor of her late husband, a former Negro League baseball player. The foundation provides gifts to the homeless, as well as college scholarships to African American young men, who now attend colleges and universities throughout the country.

Naomi departed her blessed and purpose-filled earthly life on December 12, 2021. She leaves to cherish her memory, her children, Annette, Sharron (William), Gread Jr. (Anne), and Michael (Andrea); one god-daughter, LaToya Ellerson, one god-son, Stanley Montgomery Jr., a host of grandchildren, great grandchildren, nieces, nephews, other relatives, and friends.
