Before Starting An Improvement

If you are making any type of improvement to the exterior of your home, you must submit an Architectural Improvement request form to MASC Austin Properties, Inc. before starting the work. (This includes painting the exterior, room additions, and replacement of the roof, driveway and fence, etc.)



Replacement of plant material due to freeze damage does not require an ACC form unless the entire lawn landscape hardscape needs replacement.

2021 HOA Assessments - Reminder

Kingsbridge Village, like most communities, have annual assessments that are due at the end of January. Our assessments are used for the maintenance of our community. The assessments cover the cost to maintain the common areas like our landscaping, marquee signs, and park as well as other operational costs of the neighborhood such as utilities, insurance, management fees, and recreational activities. The annual assessment for 2021 were due on January 1, 2021 but are not considered late until after January 31, 2021. There are payment plans available as well. Residents of North Mission Glen MUD Please have trash out to the curb prior to 7am for collection. TRASH IS COLLECTED TUESDAY & FRIDAY

TRASH: On each regularly scheduled collection day, Best Trash will collect residential refuse located at the curbside in the provided roll-out carts. Please place the carts on the curb facing forward. Residents are restricted to one Best Trash cart for refuse and are encouraged to confine refuse to the cart, however additional refuse may be placed in containers (between 30- 50 gallons), boxes or bags (not weighing over 40 pounds) and placed next to the Best Trash provided trash cart. Items excluded from normal collection are dirt, rocks, bricks, tile, concrete, tires, batteries, motor oil, cooking oil, insulation, sheetrock or



waste generated by a private contractor or any materials or items deemed hazardous materials. Please do not dispose of gasoline, motor oil, paints, cooking oil, or any other liquid items in a container that are not visible to Best Trash personnel. If such items result in spillage that causes a stain, Best Trash is not responsible for the cleanup. Best Trash will leave a tag explaining the reason for any non-collected item(s).

YARD & BULK WASTE: Trees, shrubs, brush trimmings and fencing must be no larger than 4 inches in diameter, no more than 4 feet long, tied in bundles not exceeding 40 pounds. (please see picture at right for an example) The tied bundles are required to allow quick pickup and size limitations are required to avoid damaging the equipment in the compacting process. Items such as appliances, furniture, mattresses, carpet (up to 1 room of carpet, cut less than 4 feet wide, tied in bundles not exceeding 40 pounds), will be picked up on both garbage collection days. Bulk pickup is offered every service day.



By Federal Law, refrigerators, freezers, and any other items containing Freon must be drained of Freon and have an accompanying bill to validate such service was performed.

Best Trash does have the ability to provide a special collection for items outside the contract terms. For pricing information, please email your district name, address and several pictures of your items to customerservice@besttrashtexas.com.

CART CARE & MAINTENANCE: Best Trash will provide each current residence with ONE trash cart. Best Trash will replace any carts that are defective or otherwise become unusable due to normal wear and tear. Lost or stolen carts can be replaced for \$65.00 + tax, each by calling Best Trash.

HOLIDAY SCHEDULE: If your regular trash or recycle collection day falls on a holiday (New Years Day, Independence Day or Christmas Day) the collection will be made on the next regularly scheduled collection day.

LIBRARIES RE-OPEN

Fort Bend County Libraries (FBCL) began the process of reopening buildings on March 15, when five locations resumed inperson service. On June 4, 2021, the library system welcomed patrons back to five additional locations: the Bob Lutts Fulshear/Simonton Branch, the First Colony Branch, the Mamie George Branch (Stafford), the Mission Bend Branch, and the Sugar Land Branch.

The Albert George Branch Library (Needville) re-opened to the public on June 9. The reopening of the Albert George Branch had been delayed so that new shelving could be installed in the building. Because of a nationwide shortage of materials, however, the new-shelving project has been delayed. Once the materials arrive, the library will need to close for approximately three weeks.

The Books & More Curbside Pick-Up service continues to be available at all locations. Please pick up items no later than 15 minutes prior to closing. If they are not picked up by that time, they will be held for the next business day.

Children from infancy through school-age are invited to read a lot of great books to kick off a great summer! Younger children will enjoy the "Youth Summer Reading Challenge," while students in grades 6-8 can participate in the "Middle School Summer Challenge." Teens in high school can participate with adults in the "YA/Adult Summer Reading Challenge."

In June and July, virtual activities will be posted each week on the Summer Reading Challenge page on the FBCL website. FBCL will also post virtual activities in the FBCL Virtual Programs & Educational Resources Facebook group page. Created by the FBCL Youth librarians, videos of activities will be posted at 10:00 am each day, according to the following schedule:

Tuesdays – Activity Time Tuesday (grades K-3) Wednesdays – Family Story Time (all ages) Thursdays – TRL (Think, Read, & Learn) (grades 4-8)
