

Rules of Debate

- A member can speak no more than twice on the same question on the same day.

- Each speech must be limited to two minutes.
- The maker of a motion has the right to be the first to speak to it.
- All remarks must be limited to the merits of the subject immediately before the assembly. (Remarks should be germane.)
- Personal remarks should be avoided, and the motives of members must not be questioned; the item, not the person, is the subject of the debate.
- Members are seldom referred to by name; officers are referred to by their titles.
- Members should be seated when another member is assigned the floor and during any interruption by the presiding officer.
