

### Trophy Field Care Top 3

1. Track, Transport, Gut - Don't Drag or Damage
2. Cape to Upper Neck – Leave Head Intact
3. Keep Cool and Dry – Don't Wash

#### Small Mammals/Fur Bearers

1. Keep Game Intact – No Gutting
2. Least Damage in Humane Kill as Possible
3. Freeze Whole - Coyote Size and Smaller
4. Transport Frozen to Your Taxidermist

#### Whitetail/Hog Field Dress

1. Do Not Slice Brisket Hide
2. Slice skin below chest to rectum around genitals
3. Cut out rectum, tie off, cut esophagus high in chest cavity
4. Remove rectum, esophagus and guts w/out contamination


#### Field Cape (Shoulder Mount)

1. Circle slice hide behind shoulder, midway of ribs
2. Slice down elbows to circle; "V" cut w/out cutting brisket
3. Use tube skin method to lower jaw & upper neck
4. Leave skin on head
