- Youth is the phase of life where we are capable of serving Allah (swt) in the best possible way.
- Unfortunately, we often see the youth around us becoming easily digressed.
- They are uninterested in religion and would rather spend their time enjoying wasteful activities.
- This is because they have a false impression that there will be plenty of time to cover up for their 'lack of spirituality' at some later time in life.
- Even though there is no guarantee about how long anyone is destined to live.
- 'Age doesn't matter' refers to the idea that a person is never too young or too old to come close to Allah.
- If we sort out our morals and stick to our faith in the time of youth then no one will be able to take us away from the path of Islam at any other time in life.



Awareness...

- The simplest thing to do is to keep an anchorage on the omnipotent personality of Allah (swt).
- This can be accomplished by following the teachings of the Quran and Ahlebait (as).
- We can understand these teachings by listening to the ulama e haqq and other authentic resources.

- Each and every one of those personalities is an example for us all to understand the power of someone who is close to Allah (swt) in the time of their childhood.
- Hazrat Ali Akbar was the second son of Imam Husain (as).
- He was eighteen years old and resembled Rasool Allah (pbuh) in looks.
- On the day of Ashura, his performance brought back memories of Imam Ali (as).
- One of the sons of Imam Hasan (as) named Qasim also volunteered to fight.
- Several narrations state that he was only thirteen to fifteen years old.
- During the battle he also fought like a brave warrior and made his uncle very proud.

- The two children of Bibi Zainab, only teenaged young boys, were trained by Hazrat Abbas in swordsmanship.
- They fought the enemies furiously and truly showed that they were the grandsons of Imam Ali (as)
- Writing about youth in Karbala cannot be complete without mentioning the name of Hazrat Ali Asghar.
- He was only six months old.
- At that age, he responded to the call of the Imam of the time,
 "Hal min nasirin yan surna" Is there anyone to help me?"
- Ali Asghar responded from his cradle.
- He will always be remembered as a symbol of strength and loyalty to the Imam of the time.

How to make the right choices at a younger age


At home:

- Be an eager learner to know about your faith so that our knowledge combined with goodness makes us a wise person.

2. He was the only person who volunteered to be the successor and helper of Prophet Mohammad (s). He is one of our Imams.






6. He was a prophet who was placed in a well by his brothers. He was sold as a slave to the Aziz of Egypt.
