

Ordinance No 986

(First Published in The Garnett Review, July 7, 1927),

An Ordinance concerning the examination and correction of water, gas and electric light meters.

Be it ordained by the governing body of the City of Garnett, *Kansas*:

Section 1. Whenever complaint shall be made by any user of water, gas or electricity in the City of Garnett that such water, gas or electric meter is not correctly measuring the quantity of water, gas or electricity used by such user, such meter shall be examined by the proper employee of said city and tested, and if upon such examination and test it shall be found that such meter is not correctly measuring the quantity of water, gas or electricity, the expense of such examination and test shall be born and paid for by said City; but if upon such examination and test it shall be found that such meter is in proper repair and is measuring such water, gas or electricity correctly, ~~the~~ the expense of such examination and test shall be paid by such user, and shall be added to the bill of such user and collected by the city clerk at the end of the month with the bill for water, gas or electricity.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force ten days after its passage and approval and its publication in The Garnett Review.
