

Every year, Soroptimist International (SI) distributes more than \$2.8 million in educational awards to about 1,700 women all over the world.

This award provides additional financial support to our Live Your Dream (LYD) Award recipients as they work toward completing their educational programs. Have you noticed receiving different-looking emails inviting you to attend committee meetings or club events? As promised, SIGP is continuing to utilize more technology to improve communication with each of you. It will be particularly helpful to those who attend meetings via Zoom or cannot attend meetings on Wednesday evenings due to other commitments.

Our committee and event chairwomen are now using SignUpGenius to invite you to committee meetings, club events and, eventually, general meetings. We are all new to this tool and ask that you have patience with it and us while we all learn how to manage and use it.

SignUpGenius is an online software tool for volunteer management and event planning. It is a wonderful way to plan and fill volunteer slots/times for events all in one place.

Think of it as the clipboard we pass around at our business meetings to take attendance and sign up to volunteer or attend an activity. With SignUpGenius, you don't even have to be physically at the meeting to sign up for something that interests you. Between Zoom and SignUpGenius every single member is included.

When you receive an invitation/signup, we ask that you fill out the invitation-RSVP. Depending on the type of invitation, volunteer times and duties may need to be filled in along with your email address. After you have completed filling out the invite, you will receive an email the day before the event reminding you of your commitment. There's usually space where you can decline an invitation.

Not to worry. If you say "yes" and then something comes up and you are unable to attend or volunteer, simply contact the committee chair about your schedule change so she can make other arrangements. Or if you responded "no" and your schedule changes, please contact the chair and tell her of your availability, or use SignUpGenius, even at the last minute. The club email is checked daily and your email replies are sent on to the appropriate committee/event chair.

We are looking to start using SignUpGenius for our general meetings before the end of the year. So, look for your invitation coming soon.

P.S. Oh, and in the beginning, please check your spam/trash folders if you haven't been receiving these emails. Put SignUpGenius in your contacts and all should go smoothly after that.

Another priest from Damongo will come in September. Perhaps we will have a chance to dine with him and learn more of what is happening at St. Anne.

St. Anne student Rocklyn is special in that she has a very noticeable case of scoliosis. Over here, disabilities are not seen as we see them. It was challenging for her at first. There was a lot of talking to the girls about how they are to treat all individuals equally. I was a bit nervous for Rocklyn at the beginning. Now she is thriving. Happily, she was voted runner up at Ninos Night. Ninos night is when the freshman class is initiated. They choose a queen and Rocklyn made runner up. I was so happy.
