One of my favorite passages in Scripture is Jeremiah 29. It was written by the prophet Jeremiah in a letter to the exiles, who are finding themselves far from home. The people have come to Babylon, under imperial rule, and they're traumatized by everything they've lost. In this moment of uprootedness, they're searching for meaning, and for something to hold onto.

In this letter, Jeremiah tells the people that they will be in Babylon for at least 70 years, a whole lifetime for them. He tells the people that they should settle down, build houses, marry and even pray for peace and prosperity in the city in which they now find themselves.

For me, this passage serves as a reminder that we don't know what God's plan is, or where God is taking us, but that we should seek to bloom where we are planted, wherever that may be. It's a reminder that we should focus on building relationships with folks at school, work or home and that by doing so, we bless and serve our communities.
