

President Victor's Focus for 2020-2022

The following is a statement of objectives which I feel we need to prioritize going forward considering the current social, political, and spiritual climate. They are merely listed but not in any ascending or descending order of importance. I imagine that some of these ideas are already in the works or are long-standing ministry efforts of the Convention; however, the contemporary contexts mandates emphasis.


- A voting education, registration, and GOTV campaign emphasizing early voting which begins in the Commonwealth on September 17th.
- As the Census concludes at the end of September, we need to have a push for BGC churches to emphasize participation and registration.
- Mental Health Wellness Webinars

- History/Oral History Project to update the convention's illustrious history
- Committee on Inclusion to ensure and augment both gender and age inclusion
- On-line Tutoring developed across the state for students who must now learn in virtual classrooms
- Seminars/Webinars for developing an On-line presence for churches, especially in rural precincts
- Round-Table talks or even TED style talks from subject matter experts from the School of Theology and other places about what Church will look like in the future after the seismic shifts brought on by the pandemic

- Some effort to address food insecurity by pairing Black farmers with Black Churches to develop a distribution network
- Have discussion about develop-٠ ing a long-range strategic plan personality/ that is not presidentially driven to ensure the future direction of the Convention. With the tenure of the president being reduced to a two -year term, coupled with the quick shifts in context in the Commonwealth, we need direction for the Convention that outlast the presidency of any elected leader in order to maintain the Convention's relevance.



GROWING CHURCHES, and



Faith Formation Shapes...



Preservation of African American Churches, Cemeteries, Historic Structures, Associated Land and Landmarks in Virginia

To Baptist General Convention Churches and Associations:



We are delighted to announce that Dominion Energy has provided a significant grant to BGCVA to assist churches and associations in historical preservation.

This is an opportunity for your church and/or association to join us in this endeavor. If interested, please fill out and return the survey.

Brief background: Many churches may be eligible based on their history of significant accomplishments to be designated as significant historical structures in Virginia and/or the United States (separate registries). The project will take your church historian or other designated persons through the process to determine if your church, other historic buildings, schools, cemeteries may be eligible to receive designations and recogni-

tions.

This initiative funded by Dominion Energy will enable Baptist General Convention of Virginia (BGCVA) to provide training for new and current Church Historians. These historians would research; document and archive all data related to the assigned church and would attend BGCVA sponsored training and other applicable training needed to conduct the work. -

The key component to the success of this initiative involves **documenting and archiving BGCVA church documents in an onsite (BGCVA) and digital archive for documents, books and digital records**. This archive would also include data and documents (special occasions, association meetings, etc.) from our churches over the years. A primary outcome for this initiative will be the creation of **digital archive of the history of BGCVA and the churches participating in the project**. This project also includes assisting churches with researching and documenting other properties including cemeteries and other structures that could possibly be recognized for their historical significance.

NOTE: Churches that currently maintain their archives and artifacts would continue to do so but participating churches would have the option of having a digital archive accessible online.

People: ¹Whoever dwells in the shelter of the Most High will rest in the shadow of the Almighty. ²I will say of the LORD, "God is my refuge and my fortress my God, in whom I trust."

- Leader: Lord, we thank you for meteorologists and scientific scholars alerting us of the storms. We praise you, O God, for the fortitude of civil servants who responded well to insure the safety of all citizens. You blessed elected officials to govern with grace and prepare us for such times.

Clergy Care & Leadership Support: When Ministers & Church Leaders Need a Minister

The telephone rings at 3:00 in the morning with a call from a church member needing to talk to you about a family member who has either died or is gravely ill. The last, quarterly church meeting was held nearly three months ago and the next one is only two weeks away, but your spirit is still wrenched from the hurtful words spoken to you in the last church meeting. You're the minister over the Couples Ministry or the leader of the Marriage Enrichment Ministry, but you can't let anyone in the church know that you and your spouse have secretly decided to separate and your belief is that your marriage will probably end in divorce. You've been "invited" to take leadership in a ministry, but you don't feel you have the training and skills necessary to successfully lead the people of God.

With the new pressures of doing ministry in a pandemic era of COVID19, many pastors are ministers are wondering where they can find confidential, clergy care and ministry leaders are likewise seeking sources for convenient and reliable ministry training. The Baptist General Convention is proud and thankful to be able to offer Conversations in Clergy Ministry and Ministry Training Track are both facilitated by Dr. William "Dr. Bill" Whitaker as a part of the BGCVA Clergy Ministry which is led by Dr. Gregory Beechaum.

Conversations in Clergy Ministry meets via Zoom every 1st Thursday at 12:00noon and provides discussions on clergy care and healthy ministry life. There is no charge for BGCVA affiliated pastors and ministers and persons who attend the monthly Conversations in Clergy Ministry sessions are provided with clergy care discussions on how to navigate and overcome ministry related crises in an effort to balance home and ministry life.

The Ministry Training Track (MTT) also meets via Zoom, but on every 3rd Monday at 12noon. MTT provides church leadership training in Baptist doctrine and polity, church governance and finances, ministry group formation, people skills, and much more.

He is the Pastor of the Covenant Fellowship Baptist Church in Chesterfield, Va., the Church Business Manager for the First Baptist Church, South Richmond, and he has served for the past two years as the facilitator of the BGCVA Ministry Training Track.




