DID YOU KNOW?

Probably the most ridiculous outcome of a battle would be when a Dutch naval fleet was captured after being charged and surrounded by French cavalry. Yup, you heard that right.

During the war of the First Coalition (1792 – 1797), the French Revolutionary Army was camping out in Amsterdam for the winter. The generals became aware of a Dutch fleet anchored at Den Helder, a nearby bay that had been frozen due to an extremely cold winter.

They sent out a regiment of "hussars" (light cavalry) with a regiment of line infantry that literally hitched a ride with them. Upon approaching Den Helder, they discovered the Dutch fleet stuck in the ice with the sailors fast asleep.

Not wishing to wake the napping sailors, the French covered the hooves of their horses with fabric and slowly maneuvered out onto the ice. When they were in position, they launched their assault. Within minutes, they had surrounded the entire fleet.

The cavalry and infantry quickly boarded and captured every ship. They suffered zero loss.

This is the only time in military history where a naval battle between warships and cavalry took place and, ridiculous as it sounds, the cavalry won.

"These Inalienable Rights"

Americans thrive on debate and controversy. This month, the "battle d' jour" is the Supreme Court essentially overturning *Roe vs. Wade.* Actually, they simply put the matter back where it belongs—in the hands of the individual states. The 1972 decision was one of the worst, most poorly supported by science, and horrific in the history of American jurisprudence. Over its lifespan of some fifty years, it caused the brutal termination of the lives of over 30 million innocent children. The decision was made by highly intelligent justices, who were totally unequipped scientifically to make such a decision.
