



The Year of Expected "Miracles"









CRUMBS OF TIME

Read: Daniel 6:10-23

Three times a day he got down on his knees and prayed, giving thanks to his God, just as he had done before.

Daniel 6:10

A friend was coming to town. He is a very busy man and his schedule was tight, but after a difficult day in important meetings, he managed to see my family for half an hour for a late dinner. We enjoyed his visit, but I remember looking at my plate and thinking, "We only got the crumbs of his time."

Then I remember how many times God gets the crumbs of my time—sometimes just the last minutes before I fall asleep.

Daniel was a busy man. He held a high government position in the ancient kingdom of Babylon, and I'm sure he had a full schedule. However, he had developed the habit of spending time with God—praying three times a day, praising God, and thanking Him. This routine helped him develop a strong faith that did not waver when he faced persecution (Daniel 6).

God desires a relationship with us. In the morning we can invite Him into our day, and then we can praise Him and ask Him for His help throughout the day. At other times we can treasure some time alone with Him and reflect on His faithfulness. As we spend time with God in prayer and in His Word, we grow in our relationship with Him and learn to become more and more like Him

DOING OUR PART

Read: 2 Kings 20:1-7

I have heard your prayer...I will heal you. On the third day from now you will go up to the temple of the Lord.

2 Kings 20:5

A runner at a school track meet crossed the finish line just ahead of his nearest rival. A bystander, noticing that the winner's lips were moving during the last couple of laps, wondered what he was saying. So he asked him about it. "I was praying," the runner answered. FIVE-FINGER PRAYERS

Read: James 5:13-18

Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other. James 5:16

Prayer is a conversation with God, not a formula. Yet sometimes we might need to use a "method" to freshen up our prayer time. We can pray the Psalms or other Scriptures (such as the Lord's Prayer), or use the ACTS method (Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, and Supplication). I recently came across this "Five-Finger Prayer" to use as a guide when praying for others:

- When you fold your hands, the thumb is the nearest you.
 So begin by praying for those closest to you—your loved ones (Philippians 1:3-5).
- The index finger is the pointer. Pray for those who teach— Bible teachers and preachers, and those who teach children (1 Thessalonians 5:25).
- The next finger is the tallest. It reminds you to pray for those in authority over you—national and local leaders and your supervisor at work (1 Timothy 2:1-2).
- The fourth finger is usually the weakest. Pray for those who are in trouble or who are suffering (James 5:13-16).
- Then comes your little finger. It reminds you of your smallness in relation to God's greatness. Ask Him to supply your needs (Philippians 4:6, 19). Anne Cetas Prayer Tip: Always incorporate your church in your prayers—pray for and with the people.

ALWAYS PRAY, AND DON'T GIVE UP

Read: Luke 18:1-8

Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up. Luke 18:1

Are you going through one of those times when it seems every attempt to resolve a problem is met with a new difficulty? You thank the Lord at night that it's taken care of but awake to find that something else has gone wrong and the problems remains.


During an experience like that, I was reading the gospel of Luke and was astounded by the opening words of chapter 18: "Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up" (v. 1). I had read the story of the persistent widow many times but never grasped why Jesus told it (vv. 2-8). Now I connected those opening words with the story. The lesson to His followers was very clear: Always pray, and never give up.

Prayer is not a means of coercing God to do what we want. It is a process of recognizing His power and plan for our lives. In prayer we yield our lives and circumstances to the Lord and trust Him to act in His time and in His way.

As we rely on God's grace not only for the outcome of our requests but for the process as well, we can keep coming to the Lord in prayer, trusting His wisdom and care for us.

Our Lord's encouragement to us is clear: Always pray, and don't give up! David McCasland

Kingdomtide begins on the last Sunday in August and continues until the beginning of Advent. The emphasis includes evangelism, world missions, and the work for peace and justice in all relationships. During this period, special emphasis is placed on the Kingship of the Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. The observance is wrapped up in the heightened awareness of one of the basic tenets of the Christian faith – the hope of the coming of the Kingdom of Heaven

Color: Green is symbolic of freshness of nature, hope, life and growth.

Advent is the season of expectation, hope and celebration of the past, present, and future comings of Jesus Christ to the world. Much of the focus is on the prophecy of the coming of the Messiah to Israel and the expectancy of that fulfillment. The Advent cry is "Come," even though Emmanuel has come. Jesus has come, presently comes into the hearts of believers through grace, and is yet to return. This season is a time of anticipation as the Church makes ready for the coming of the Lord and the celebration of Jesus coming as a babe in Bethlehem. Therefore, Advent embodies a vital element of the Christian faith. The Advent season has marked the beginning of the Christian Year since the eight-century and consists of the four weeks before Christmas.

Color: Purple (violet or Lilac) is the color used to denote royalty, praying, fasting, and penitence. It represents a symbol of the majesty of Christ, and Jesus' humanity, suffering, and fasting.

Devotional Reading: 2 Corinthians 6:1-10

Background Scripture: Acts 4:32-5:11

DECLARATION:

Acts 4:32-5:11

They Had Everything in Common Now the full number of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one said that any of the things that belonged to him was his own, but they had everything in common. 33 and with great power the apostles were giving their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. ³⁴ There was not a needy person among them, for as many as were owners of lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold 35 and laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need. 36 Thus Joseph, who was also called by the apostles Barnabas (which means son of encouragement), a Levite, a native of Cyprus, ³⁷ sold a field that belonged to him and brought the money and laid it at the apostles' feet.

Ananias and Sapphira

¹ But a man named Ananias,
with his wife Sapphira, sold a piece
of property, ² and with his wife's
knowledge he kept back for himself
some of the proceeds and brought
only a part of it and laid it at the
apostles' feet. ³ But Peter said,
"Ananias, why has Satan filled your
heart to lie to the Holy Spirit and
keep back for yourself part of the
proceeds of the land? ⁴ While it

remained unsold, did it not remain your own? And after it was sold, was it not at your disposal? Why is it that you have contrived this deed in your heart? You have not lied to man but to God." ⁵ when Ananias heard these words, he fell down and breathed his last. And great fear came upon all who heard of it. ⁶ The young men rose and wrapped him up and carried him out and buried him.

⁷ After an interval of about three hours his wife came in, not knowing what had happened. 8 And Peter said to her, "Tell me whether you [a] sold the land for so much." and she said, "Yes, for so much." But Peter said to her, "How is it that you have agreed together to test the Spirit of the Lord? Behold, the feet of those who have buried your husband are at the door, and they will carry you out." 10 Immediately she fell down at his feet and breathed her last. When the young men came in they found her dead, and they carried her out and buried her beside her husband. 11 And great fear came upon the whole church and upon all who heard of these things.

Affirmation:

ENGAGE

In every community, there are people who have less than they need to maintain healthy lives. How can we help to assure that the needs of everyone in our communities are met? As the first believers in Jesus shared everything in common, the needs of everyone were satisfied. We live in various societies throughout the world which have differing economic systems that determine the attitudes we have toward worldly possessions.

For instance, those living in a socialist economy will have a different attitude toward possessions and sharing of one's goods with others from those living in a capitalist economy. Break into groups and debate the issue: Christians are bound by the standards of the society they live in when it comes to possessions and sharing with others and not by biblical standards set by the Early Church. Consider also the following issues in your discussions.

We may view possessions as a way of "keeping score" -this is, we see wealth as evidence of importance.

We rarely see ourselves as being rich and often are envious of those who have more than we do.

We would like to be known for being generous even if we are not.

We are usually more likely to give when we learn of a specific project or an immediate need.

We prefer distributing our money as we see fit.

Finally, what would you conclude is the right attitude and character of Christians when it comes to meeting the needs of people both in the church and in the society?

EDUCATE

Acts 4:32-37: The sharing in the early church was not mandatory but was spontaneous and voluntary (Acts 5:4). Some, such as Mary (mother of John Mark) still owned a house in Jerusalem sometime later (Acts 12:12). Though the particular giving arrangement described in Acts 2 and 4 is not seen elsewhere in the New Testament, the spirit behind it does continue (2 Corinthians 9:7). The

(Wisdom from page 8) explosive growth of the church from the beginning (Acts 2:41) may have created the need for the unique communal arrangement described in Acts 2:44 and 4:32. many of the Jewish pilgrims from all over the world who had stayed in Jerusalem between Passover and Pentecost (Acts 2:5) would have become believers and may have decided to extend their stay. That would explain why the church's practice of selling all of one's property for the good of the community did not appear to have extended beyond Jerusalem. The lack of poverty described in Acts 4:34 recalls the promise of Deuteronomy 15:4-6 and the apparent universal prosperity under the rule of Solomon (1 Kings 4:25). At the beginning of the nation of Israel, the tribe of Levi was not allotted land as an inheritance. By the time the church began, however, Joseph of Cyprus called Barnabas was a landowner. The selfless nature of Joseph that caused him to be known as the "son of encouragement" is evident in the following chapters of Acts. He reconciled does the system work when taking the Saul of Tarsus with the church that Saul once persecuted (Acts 9:26-27); led one of the first churches to have both Jewish and Gentile believers (11:19-24); and played a key role in the first major missionary campaign of the church (Acts 13-14).

Acts 5:1-11: The communal economic system of the early Jerusalem church was not utopian. It tempted Ananias and Sapphira to lie about their generosity (Acts 5:3, 8-9) and also stirred controversy when some believed that the goods were not distributed equitably (Acts 6:1). "This chilling account of the sudden deaths of Ananias (Hebrew, "the Lord is gracious") and Sapphira (Aramaic, "beautiful") makes us face the fact that God deals with sin, especially church members' deceit and lack of integrity. If God acts to preserve the integrity of the community that the gospel produced, we can have increased confidence in the truthfulness of the message itself (Luke 1:4). That's the

good news for the inquirer. This narrative is bad news, though, for any who would take a casual approach to entering the kingdom of God" (The IVP New Testament Commentary Series). One view of the incident of Ananias and Sapphira is, "Ananias and Sapphira learn 1. 1 Display some bumper stickers or that in this life God can and, when he chooses, will punish sinners either by immediate death or by some other means. This can happen to those who claim to be, and may truly be, a part of his covenant people, enjoy his salvation blessings and yet deliberately sin and remain unrepentant (1 Cor 5:5; 1 Jn 5:16 -17). For Christians today this is still a temptation: to so luxuriate in the love and grace of God that we do not take seriously the consequences of our deliberate sinning. But God will not be mocked (Gal 6:7-8)" (Ibid).

ELEVATE

As a group share and discuss examples of communal living among Christian groups you know, such as Roman Catholic Nuns and Monks. How vow of poverty? Compare this with what Jesus tells the rich young ruler, "Go and sell all you have and give to the poor and 5. come and follow me." what individuals do you know of in history and in your own time and experience have sacrificed great riches for the love of Christ and his mission in the world? - Would you say that many Christians share their time and unique abilities as well as their material wealth?
- Do we as Christians trust the church leaders to distribute our offering gifts

- responsibly?
- Do we value the characteristic of humility in all aspects of life, including giving?

iTHINK

- humorous signs that reflect our culture's view of money: e.g., "Always borrow money from a pessimist; he doesn't expect to be paid back." "Money talk-mine says 'Goodbye.'" "Double your moneyfold it over and put it back in your pocket."
- Perform an Internet search for 2. "wealthiest Americans" and most generous Americans." Present those two lists to the class.
- 3. Discuss how the principles of loving others in 1 John 3 (session 11) may have been operative in Acts 4:32-37 and the experiences of the early church.
- Since Joseph of Cyprus was given a nickname for his lifestyle, have the group try to come up with nicknames for Ananias and Sapphira that reflect what we know or can infer about them.
- Have the group read Paul's words about giving in 2 Corinthians 7-8. even though this church did not have the same giving arrangements as the church in Jerusalem, compare the attitudes and purposes for the giving of both churches.
- Help participants create personal "Time, Talents, and Treasures" lists. The lists should include specific ways they will pledge to be more generous in all three of these areas.



He parks the jeep at the place PERFECTLY well as the captain wanted. The young man came out of the jeep and saw them all crying.



ENGAGE

Because injustice is so prevalent and frequent in our world and our communities, we must ask ourselves: have we become so accustomed to violence or injustice that it fails to move us, such that we feel no compassion for those who suffer? The more we understand God's will for the world, the more compelled we fail to express our displeasure and dismay in the injustices we see in the world. What we feel about or toward various forms of injustice will no longer go unchallenged. Anyone who carries the passion for justice always finds a way for his or her voice to be heard.

Have you know anyone or personally been mistreated or suffered for someone who did wrong? We are familiar with events in the past that led to protest against wrong. Now, it will be our turn to tech present and future generations how to demonstrate or protest in the face of evil and how to show compassion to persons who are ill-treated. We need willing voices to speak up and be a voice for the people. Are you willing to be that voice?

EDUCATE

Our text and lesson today introduce us to a unique situation. Prophets often take on the role of speaking for God, but in the opening of the book of Habakkuk, the prophet is speaking with God, and doing so in a way that shows raw

emotions on the part of the prophet.

Habakkuk is speaking for the community. As one of the Minor Prophets, so called because of the length of their writings in Scripture, Habakkuk's voice is heard in a major wat as he complains to God. Habakkuk raises two areas of complaint. He is disturbed that God seems to tolerate evil; and he wonders how long it will be before God addresses or fixes the evil in the land. Habakkuk begins his writing/prophecy in chapter 1 by asking God, "O Lord, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen? Or cry to you 'Violence!' and you will not save?" (Habakkuk 1:1-2).

As we continue to read through the chapter, we notice how in verse 12, the prophet still has not had an answer from God. This is why Habakkuk appeals to God's goodness and constancy. As he appeals, Habakkuk wonders or questions that if God is good, why does God not act? Why do bad things continue to happen? Why will God not intervene when injustices of all forms take place? The prophet asks in verse 12, "Are you not from old, O Lord my God, my Holy One? You shall not die. O Lord, you have marked them for judgement; and you, O Rock, have established them for punishment." Habakkuk makes a plea to God to step in and address this situation, to change the landscape and do what he believes God can do. The prophet feels confident to express his concerns to God because, as he says of God. "Your eyes are too pure to behold evil, and you cannot look on wrongdoing; why do you look on the treacherous, and are silent when the wicked swallow those more righteous than they?" (v. 13)

Have you been told that we are not to question God? How do you feel about this instruction?

Often as we pray, there are specific questions that are present in our conversations with God. It may seem as if God does not hear our prayers because the answer or evidence does not always present itself in the time we would like or think it should. Have you ever wondered or doubted if God hears or is even concerned with what we are dealing with? Yet, when we hear or receive an answer to our prayers, it is reassuring, and we are encouraged.

As we seek to do God's will, let us continue praying for those who are being treated unfairly. We must remain encouraged our faith in God (that is the meaning of Habakkuk's name, from a root word in Hebrew that means, "to embrace") because God is concerned about everyone.

ELEVATE

Quite often, as we watch events unfold in this world, it seems that evil is running amok. Wicked people seem to be in control and out of control! It's enough to drive us to despair.

But Habakkuk discusses and engages God about those who do not live justly or walk by faith. This frustration leads the prophet to ask a series of "How long?" questions in his prophetic writings. It certainly is frustrating for us as it was for the prophet to observe people who claim to be followers of God, and yet do wickedly. The prophet's words are a warning here. He admonishes the people that a just God will not tolerate their evil forever. The wicked are called to turn their lives around, and serve God in an acceptable way, as they know they should. The words of the prophet in Habakkuk chapter 1 are what prompts the response from God in chapter 2. wicked people seem to be getting ahead. But Habakkuk's message is simple and straightforward. They will not succeed in the end.

The background is that Maya Moore's family had heard about a man who had been in jail for a felony he claimed he did not commit. Through a prison's ministry work back in 2007, Ms. Moore visited the felon in jail shortly before her own freshman year at the University of Connecticut, where she eventually, became one of the most heralded women's basketball players in collegiate history.

Not familiar with who this basketball player is?

Maya April Moore is an American and International professional basketball player for the Minnesota Lynx of the Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA). In a "Performer of the Year" Inaugural ceremony in 2017, the Sports Illustrated magazine categorized Maya Moore as the greatest winner in the history of women's basketball. As at this time she has taken time off, on sabbatical, to pursue exploits that center on securing justice for individuals who may have been harmed by the justice system of this country.

Speaking of American justice system, we need to get a few facts out for clarity. First, we need to be aware of the fact that the incarcerating of people has systematically become the primary form of punishment and rehabilitation for people who commit felonies and other offenses. The actual process to investigate and interrogate, to prosecute and to punish and or to rehabilitate those who commit various crimes has become a mammoth business; a major industrial complex in America. According to a 2020 review study, this massive incarceration system in the United States "cannot be explained without reference to the centrality of racial politics" and cultural and systematic oppression. There is a general observation that minorities such as African Americans and Hispanics are more likely to be arrested for various crimes than white people in the United States.

It is also important to note that "tough-on-crime" laws adopted in the 1980s have filled American prisons with mostly nonviolent offenders. According to that justice for a lot of people has been the U.S. Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS) in 2018 Black males accounted for 34% of the total male prison population, white males 29%, and Hispanic males 24%. The imprisonment

rate for Black males (2,272 per 100,000 Black male residents) was 5.8 times as high as for white males (392 per 100,000 white male residents). Out of all ethnic groups, African Americans, Puerto Rican Americans, and Native Americans have some of the highest rates of incarceration. The massive numbers of imprisonment point to serious incidents of false and made-up charges, as well as wrongful accusations that eventually end up to wrongful incarcerations.

Which is where we re-connect to Ms. Moore and the story of this essay. The other person in the story is Mr. Jonathan Irons. He was 16 at the time the crime for of raping a white woman. An all-white which he was convicted occurred. He was prosecuted for burglarizing a home in a St. Louis, Missouri suburb and assaulting the homeowner with a gun. Even though there were no corroborating witnesses, fingerprints, DNA or any blood evidence connecting Mr. Irons to the crime, he was dully convicted by an all-white jury on charges of burglary and assault. He had pleaded not guilty to the charges maintaining all along that he was not at the scene of the crime. Regardless of his protestations and in spite of legal defense, he ended up behind bars, to a 50 year term. He was 16 at that time but was tried as an adult.

You would think this is some extraordinarily weird case of random proportions, citing the fact that most inmates claim innocence to any manner of conviction. Not so simple, and not so fast. "Collecting data from the 281 known DNA exonerations in the US since the late 1980s, a conservative estimate is that 1 percent of the US prison population, approximately 20,000 people, have been falsely convicted. In fact, since the late 1980s there have been as many as 850 exonerations nationwide, according to University of Michigan law professor Samuel Gross, a leading researcher in this field. Many of them float under the radar, Dr. Gross says, unlike the highly publicized DNA exonerations."

Combining the earlier stats about the disproportionate levels of incarceration of Black men in American prisons, any reasonable observer can conclude that justice anywhere in this nation. is not been served to a large number of black men in particular. In reality, it is easy to see misplaced and misapplied. In February 2020, a total of 2,551 exonerations were mentioned in the National Registry of Exonerations. A large percentage of these are black men who were convicted

on flimsy charges, prosecuted aggressively and found guilty by racially biased jurors and then sentenced based on racially biased judiciary systems waving flags of 'tough on crime' principles that clearly point to justice misplaced and misapplied.

The "innocent project" organization has stories of wrongfully convicted people, mostly black men, that will make you sick to your stomach. Here's an example:

Ronnie Long, now 64, was accused jury found him guilty of rape and burglary in 1976 and had him sentenced to life in prison. Even though he vehemently denied any wrongdoing and maintained his innocence, he was kept in jail for 44 years until this year, 2020. His conviction was vacated on the submission of alternate evidence by the "innocent project" team of lawyers, after the state of North Carolina filed a motion in federal court seeking to do so. Since Long was convicted, "a trickle of post-trial disclosures has unearthed a troubling and striking pattern of deliberate police suppression of material evidence," a clear case of justice misplaced and misapplied in another case of an innocent black man.

When will we be free from these horrible injustices? No one can tell, but the events of this year, 2020 from the uproar after the killing of George Floyd and others, coupled with the singular success story of Ms. Maya April Moore and Mr. Jonathan Irons provide ample conviction that individuals acting in good faith, buoyed by the facts and truth, will eventually rise to rescue victims of misplaced justices, and provide the necessary correction and remedy. As is common in Ghanaian diction, "God's time is the best". For the part I intend to play in this story, I am making all the effort and exploring every avenue to connect with the incomparable superstar Ms. Moore to see what I can do and how best I can spend my blessed time to help some brother or a sister in need,

Read: Isaiah 55:10-13

Lily, a Bible translator, was flying home to her country when she was detained at the airport. Her mobile was searched, and when the officials found an audio copy of the New Testament on it, they confiscated the phone and questioned her for two hours. At one point they asked her to play the Scripture app, when happened to be set at Matthew 7:1-2: "Do not judge, or you too will be judged. For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you." Hearing these words in his own language, one of the officers turned pale. Later, she was released and no further action was taken.

We don't know what happened in the official's heart at the airport, but we known that the word that goes out from [God's] mouth" accomplish what He desires (Isaiah 55:11). Isaiah prophesied these words of hope to God's people in exile, assuring them that even as the rain and snow make the earth bud and grow, so too what goes "out from [His] mouth" achieves His purposes (vv. 10-11).

We can read this passage to bolster our confidence in God. When we're facing unyielding circumstances, such as Lily with the airport officials, may we trust that God is working-even when we don't see the final outcome.

Read: Joshua 1:1-9

Each night, as young Celeb closed his eyes, he felt the darkness envelop him. The silence of his room was regularly suspended by the creaking of the wooden house in Costa Rica. Then the bats in the attic became more active. His mother had to put a nightlight in his room, but the young boy still feared the dark. One night Caleb's dad posted a Bible verse on the footboard of his bed. It read: "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid;...for the Lord your God will be with you" (Joshua 1:9). Caleb began to read those words each night-and he left that promise from God on his footboard until he went away to college.

So what can you and I do?


Where do we stand in this time?

When dealing with past hurts, we all know that it's right to forgive, even when it's difficult. However, few of us rarely take the next step that God wants us to take.

The Bible talks about various kinds of love. There's the Greek word "phileo," which means friendship or tender affection. Then there's "eros," which is the passionate love we feel for a lover. But there's a third kind, a higher kind of love.

"Agape" is the kind of love God has toward His Son and the human race. It's a love that sacrifices, the love that we see in John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only

Soo..." (NIV)

There are so many scriptures on this topic. It's really something you should sit something encouraging or by not saying down and study personally. Another scripture that teaches the concept of agape love is Matthew 5:44. it tells us to love our enemies and pray for those who persecute us.

It's not difficult to pray for people who are good to you. But it does stretch you to pray for people who have wounded you. It's easy to hang out with your friends at church. But it's harder to seek out that person who looks like they're miserable and alone and just listen to them for awhile. That's agape love. It's sacrificing your comfort to do what's righteous.

You can "agape love' people by being patient with them, by being understanding with them, by saying anything when you could. As humans, we are inherently selfish, constantly asking, "What about me?' It's time to declare war on selfishness with the power of agape love.

It's time to be good and loving to people on purpose as we study and understand what scripture says about love. And let the agape love of God in you overflow to others

A Bird's Eye View Of The Bible

Old Testament

There are 39 books in the Old Testament library.
There are four types of writing in the Old Testament:
Law, History, Poetry, Prophecy.

It is helpful to know which kind of literature you are reading before you start: is it poetry, or is it history?

LAW Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy.

The first five books of the Bible are sometimes called the a Law of Moses. They give many of God's laws about how to live.

HISTORY

Joshua, Judges, Ruth, 1&2 Samuel, 1&2 Kings, 1&2 Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther.

These 12 historical books cover the occupation of the Promised Land, the time of the Judges, Israel's kings, the fall of the two kingdoms and a return to Jerusalem.

POETRY Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs.

Nearly one third of the Old Testament is written in poetry. These five poetical books ask profound questions about evil, pain, love, wisdom and God.

PROPHECY

Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, Daniel, Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi.

The 17 prophetical books account for almost a quarter of the Bible. They are divided into "Major Prophets" (the first five books) and, "Minor Prophets" (the last 12). The "Minor" ones are shorter, not less important.

New Testament

There are 27 books in the New Testament library
There are three types of writing in the New Testament:
History, Letters, Prophecy.

Before you study a New Testament book it helps to consider what kind of literature you are reading: is it a letter or is it history?

HISTORY Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Acts

The first four books, called gospels, are not like our modern biographies. But they do give four portraits of Jesus. Acts is part two of Luke, about the early church.

LETTERS PAUL'S LETTERS

Romans, 1 Corinthians, 2 Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, 1 Thessalonians, 2 Thessalonians, 1 Timothy, 2 Timothy, Titus, Philemon.

We have 13 of Paul's letters. Expect for one personal one, Philemon, they were all written to groups of Christians.

OTHER LETTERS Hebrews, James, 1 Peter, 2 Peter, 1 John, 2 John, 3 John, Jude.

We don't know who wrote Hebrews. Tradition states that all the writers of the New Testament, except for John, were martyred.

PHOPHECY Revelation

Written by the apostle John, this book has seven letters to churches and numerous visions about God.



You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the spirit."

Nicodemus is first mentioned in John 3:1. He was a pharisee and a member of the Sanhedrin, the highest Jewish civil and judicial authority. The Sanhedrin was led by the high priest and consisted of seventy members: "the chief priests," the elders and the teachers of the law" (Mark 14:53). Nicodemus id mentioned again in John 7:45-52 and finally in John 19:38-42. Joseph of Arimathea, a rich man and another prominent member of the council, asked Pilate for Jesus' body to be taken down from the cross. Nicodemus and Joseph embalmed His body and buried Him in a new tomb, which belonged to Joseph (Matthew 27:57-60; Mark 15:43; Luke 23:50-53).

BLACK IVES MATTER



When you have a scale that is out of balance, to even things up, you can either add more to one side or take away from the other. The **Black Lives Matter** movement suggests that the scales of justice are out of balance.

To get into balance, this movement is asking us to add more attention to the civil rights and treatment of black individuals and ensure that the weight put upon the value of protecting black lives is equal to the weight put upon that of all Americans' lives. This movement is not about taking away from the value of other lives, but, simply, balancing the scales.

To counter with "All Lives Matter" is to suggest that you think the scale is already balanced – I assure you, it is not. The Black Lives Matter movement does not suggest any lives should matter less, just that they all should matter equally as much.
