# Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

5<sup>th</sup> Easter Sunday

Year C

John 13:31-33a, 34-35

Glory Be! There's a lot of glory going on in today's gospel. The word is mentioned five times in two verses. But what is glory? In the Old Testament, 'glory' (Hebrew Kabod) often referred to the very presence of God revealed. 'Glory' refers to God appearing in fire or cloud as God led the Israelites our of Egypt (Exodus 13:21). The 'Glory Cloud' (Ex 16:7) or the 'Consuming Fire' (Exodus 24:17) was a sign of God's presence in the desert. Later when the Temple was built, we read that 'Glory of the Lord filled the Temple, as a cloud' (1 Kings 8:11). When we recall the Old Testament importance of clouds and fire representing God's presence, it is remarkable that as the Transfiguration of Jesus occurs on the mountainside, we hear that Peter James and John "saw Jesus' Glory" (Luke 9:32) and "a cloud came and cast a shadow over them" (Luke 9:34). And what is required to cast a shadow but, a back-lighting source such as fire-light would cause? Since the Presence of God is Glory, then Jesus' shining Glory reveals His identity as God Himself. It seems like Glory becomes synonymous for God. We do find that in the New Testament, Jesus is actually called 'Glory'. For example, in Ephesians 1:17, we hear that the source of wisdom is the 'Father of Glory'. If we read that as a Name, we know Jesus is the Son of the Father, so Jesus' name is Glory. Also, 1 Corinthains 2:8 tells us that rulers of this world 'crucified the Lord of Glory' (James 2:1 also).

But even without all of the scriptural background just mentioned, we can also ask about how people typically use the word 'glory'. What do we mean by 'glory'? Often, we use the word everyday to mean something awesome, radiant, brilliant, overwhelming or victorious—that its unsurpassable (cannot be topped!) That is God! The Utmost Honor, Splendor and Dignity! When Jesus was baptized, another dimension of 'Glory' is introduced, too, and it is God's Choosing or 'stamping as desired' a particular type of presence – Jesus-Everyone should be like Him. The Father is 'glorifying' Jesus at His Baptism (with the spotlight attention of the Spirit Dove and Divine Voice). The Baptism reveals that God affirms that Jesus embodies His own Will perfectly. What God wants is what Jesus does. If we ever question what God's will is, we need only to look at Jesus (Ask what would Jesus do, and do it!) Luke 3:22 says it, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." God's glory is the shining example of all God desires. This is where we disciples come in. We are called to reflect something of the Glory of Jesus by our own following of Him. We please/serve God to the degree, that we look like or shine Jesus on to others. St Paul will tell us in Romans 8:16-17 "we are children of God.... if only we share in his suffering and then also we will share in his glory....."

And just where is Jesus saying all of this 'glory' talk that we hear in today's gospel? It is at the Last Supper, where Jesus lays it all out on the table (literally Himself). As He institutes the memorial of His sacrifice, the sinless Lamb of God, dies that we may live, gives His life (Body and Blood) to feed us eternally, His actions give us His glory. The Glory of the Cross – "when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself" (John 12:32). Again, what pleases the Father, glorifies the Father, and embodies the Father's Will. It is any selfless service and sacrificial compassion given to others in Jesus' Name! Of course, Jesus not only tells the apostles about His sacrificial death that will happen the next day, but He also commands them to continue His ongoing sacrificial service of love for others through perpetual acts of 'feetwashing' done as His ministry. ('Do this in memory of me' - Jn 13:15). This life-giving service supportive of those around us, is our sharing in Jesus' glory (Gal 6:14). When we allow the face of Christ to shine through us, then we further that shine of Jesus upon others! And what a gift to us, even if it is sacrifice, that we can join His glory. Sharing everything with Christ, means that we share in all He brings, and that includes (unsurpassable peace) the fullest joy. Jesus says, "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete" (John 15:11). Talk about Heaven on Earth. That is Beatific!


