# **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

- 1. Doors open for entries in the flower division: Thursday, August 7, 3-8PM
- 2. Perishables (roses, hemerocallis, phlox, artistic floral arrangements ) may be placed until 8:30 am Friday, August 8, but must preregister for each on Thursday, August 7 **\*\*\*Judging starts at**

# 9:00 Friday morning

3. Be prepared to state promptly where you want your flowers entered. Study the schedule at home.

- 4. All specimen entries must be grown by the exhibitor or by a member of the family.
- 5. Only one entry in any class from the same family member
- 6. Exhibitors must furnish their own clear container
- 7. Containers will not count points in the single flower entries.
- 8. Each specimen must have some of its own foliage
- All foliage should be above the water line, or above vase opening.
- 9. In specimen classes, stem and foliage are to be in proportion to the blossoms Please take into consideration the size of the flower to the size of the container. Wedging materials are permitted in the neck of the container.
- 10. Classes may be combined or subdivided at the discretion of the judge
- 11. Horticulture divisions, all classes: First prize-\$1.00 Second prize -\$.75 Third prize-\$.50 Artistic Design division: First prize \$1.00 Second prize-\$.75 Third prize-\$.50
- 12. Best of Show Award (purple ribbon) AND \$10 awarded to the outstanding exhibit overall Growers Choice Award (purple ribbon) and \$10 awarded to the outstanding flower and container

Accessories are permitted in all artistic design classes

#### Fresh flower arrangements may be placed until 8:30 am Friday, August 8, as long as you preregister each entry Thursday, August 7

Class 1: "May Day Basket"- arrangement using fresh foliage and/or flowers

Class 2: "Wild Thing" – arrangement using fresh flowers, spent flowers, country road findings, etc. Class 3: "It's a Small World"- miniature arrangement using fresh flowers (no bigger than 6"x6" overall size)

Class 4: "Anything Goes"- flowers planted in any unusual container (example: wagon, tool box, chicken feeder, etc.)

Class 5: Succulent Centerpiece – planted pot with succulents meant for a tabletop

Class 6: Hanging Basket – the committee will supply a rack to hang them from

Class 7: Patio Container: **Height of container should be higher than 14**", planted container with flowers, plants, etc

First place will be awarded the "Sis' Favorite" award of \$25.00 in memory of Margaret (Sis Rasmussen) Simonsen

Class 8: Tabletop Container: **height of pot should be less than 14**", planted pot with flowers, plants, etc
