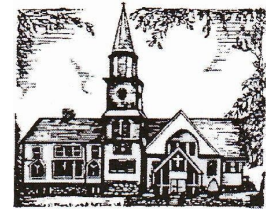

## A Word From Rev Jackson



Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ:

Hard to believe that the summer season is upon us. Flowers and trees are in bloom and everything is green all around us! We hope you will join us on the lawn each Sunday for worship at 10:00 am.

In the spirit of "Christmas in July", I want to lift up a line from the beautiful Christmas spiritual, Sweet Little Jesus Boy, where it says, *"The world treats you mean Lord, treats me mean too. But that's how things are down here, we didn't know it was you."*

Persecution of Christians outside the church and within the church has been a problem from day one. We are naive to assume that "mean treatment" only occurs out in the world. Driving people away from Christ is a continuous threat and seems to be a lifelong goal for some "Christians".

Denzel Washington wrote some great words when he said, "You must become OK with not being liked. No matter how loving or kind you are, you will never please people your way into collective acceptance. You could be a whole ray of sunshine and people will still dislike you because they are used to rain. Be OK with shining regardless."

The apostle Paul struggled with this problem as well and writes about it in II Timothy 4: 14-18. *"Alexander the coppersmith did me great harm; the Lord will requite him for his deeds. Beware of him yourself, for he strongly opposed our message. At my first defense no one took my part; all deserted me. May it not be charged against them! But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength to proclaim the word fully, that all the Gentiles might hear it. So I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from every evil and save me for his heavenly kingdom. To him be the glory for ever and ever. Amen."*

The back story is that Alexander had initially joined the start-up Christian church. But, as Christianity spread and people no longer bought his metal idol gods, Alexander and others lost money. So he opposed the church and abandoned Christ. He became a cancer from within and his words did a great deal of harm to Paul's ministry. This betrayal and subsequent gossip continues today even in the church. We need to be on guard against this kind of behavior. We should claim the verse, *"But the Lord stood at my side and gave me strength ..."* This is our hope and promise in the midst of negativity.

As Paul said to the Corinthian church in II Corinthians 12:9-10, *"but he said to me, 'My*

*grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' I will all the more gladly boast of my weaknesses, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities; for when I am weak, then I am strong."* Paul's ministry continued to be fruitful in spite of his difficulties. The strength, power and effectiveness of Christ's ministry was revealed through Paul's struggles.

We are called to always remember who is keeping our ship afloat in the future. When we encounter persecutions or receive bad press as we attempt to do good, always remember who is behind us protecting us from the storms of life.

May God grant each of us a fruitful summer and may He use our spiritual gifts to touch and encourage the lives of those we will encounter.

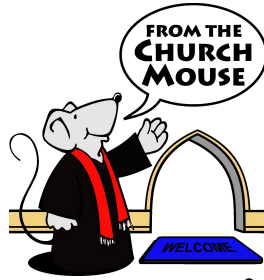
*We will continue holding our services outside until September 5<sup>th</sup> and if the weather cooperates, maybe even longer. We will worship inside if we have rain.*

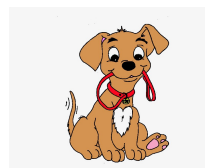
