Aloha Kakou,

Last month I talked about how it is okay for us to love ourselves just as we are, right where we are, without condition. We live by grace, by the unconditional love of God in Christ. As Christians, we love because God first loved us (1 John 4:19).

Since then, the fires on Maui have left many of us devastated. Too many people died. Too many are missing. Too many are houseless. Too many pets and other animals died and went missing, too. So much was lost.

Too many people I know and love have died this year. I am writing this note to you on what would have been my late sister Paula's 59th birthday (August 30th). So I am feeling sad all the way round.

I heard recently that grief is love that has lost its object of love, the beloved Other. The relationship has been broken. The beloved Other has gone missing. That Other can be a person, a place, a thing ... even a sacred site, like a church burnt to the ground and with it all its history. A few years ago as we were in the throes of the pandemic, I preached a sermon about how it would be important to grieve everyone and everything we have lost. After the Great Influenza of 1918-20 faded away, everyone stopped talking about it. They pretended that the flu pandemic never happened. Even the great writers of the Roaring Twenties never mentioned it again. They acted as if it never happened. And they paid the mental, emotional, and spiritual price for forgetting it.

We cannot do that. We cannot forget, whether it be a pandemic, a fire, or a loved one. To forget is to stop loving ourselves, our loved ones, the creation, and even God.

We love because God first loved us. It is okay to be sad, to grieve, because that is the way of love.



Give Aloha Returns September 1st

Once again CLC is registered to participate in the annual Give Aloha program, sponsored by Foodland/Western Union.

How It Works

From **September 1-30**, customers are invited to make donations of up to \$249 to participating Hawaii non-profit organizations at checkout. Donations are accepted at any Foodland, Sack N Save or Foodland Farms checkout. Foodland and the Western Union Foundation will match a portion of each donation. Individuals must use their own Maika'i number to make a donation. Donations made without a Maika'i number will not be matched.

How to Donate

At checkout, present your Maika'i card (or provide your number) and inform the cashier that you would like to make a donation to **Christ Lutheran Church**, code number **77769**. If you do not have a Maika'i card/number, you may request to establish one. Your donation will be added to your grocery purchase total. You may donate up to \$249 per organization; any portion exceeding \$249 will not be matched. The amount you donate and the name of our organization will appear on your receipt. Donations must be payable to Foodland or Sack N Save.

Acknowledgement of Your Donation

Donor names will not be released to our organization. Therefore, if you would like to us to know of your gift, (and include it on your quarterly statement for tax purposes), please contact us directly so that we may properly acknowledge your gift & ask the cashier for a duplicate receipt to submit to us. These gifts are tax deductible to the fullest extent of the law. Keep your receipt for tax purposes.

Matching Gift

CLC will receive 100% of all customer donations given to us, plus each donation made with a Maika'I membership will be partially matched by a gift from Foodland and the Western Union Foundation. Matching gifts will be determined at the end of the program.
