OPERATIONS

May is here and it's like getting a fresh start to the year after a cold and windy winter. Shrubs are budding, flowers are blooming and things are starting to look cheery again. It's an exciting month, unless of course you're an allergy sufferer like me!

We have begun the Spring raking with the help of some volunteers. We've managed to get quite a bit done, leaving some smaller areas as well as the Donald Drive entrance and Clubhouse area. We will be having another Community Cleanup Day as you've probably already seen on the front page. Mark your calendars, it will be Thursday May 12 with a rain date of May 19th. We will be concentrating our efforts in the pond area and Donald Drive Clubhouse. I would like to thank those volunteers who have already given of their time. They are John Gunn, Joyce Wilson, Paul Sullivan, Jack Cyr and Linda Edwards. I know there are some who are helping "incognito," so I want to thank you as well.

A cleanup reminder. Please, if you have a carport and it is raining or rain is in the forecast, we ask that you keep your leaf bags under the end of your carport. When the bags are wet, it makes them that much heavier. If the weather is clear then they should be put by the roadside

Many have asked and yes, we do plan on selling loam and mulch to the residents this year with delivery on Fridays only. The cost has gone up slightly from last year due to price increases. The cost for a yard of loam is \$40.00 and the cost for a yard of mulch is \$45.00. The process will be the same. You need to pay the receptionist for your order. You will receive a receipt and a copy will be

placed in Jeff's mailbox in the package room. Again, deliveries will be on Fridays only. We will dump the loam/mulch as close to the area you want it in as best we can. The size of the dump truck may not always make it possible.

To those residents who had their yards disturbed by the Comcast contractor last year while they were installing vaults, I met with the Comcast Engineer and the owner of Eustis Cable, the contractor hired by Comcast regarding restoring the front yards of the residents impacted by their project. We rode through the community evaluating the work that was done last year, since some of it was unacceptable. They have been back raking and seeding the areas they dug up since our meeting. If you had work done in your yard but it does not appear that the restoration has been completed, please let me know and I will contact the contractor. I have done an inspection myself, but I want to be sure nothing was missed. Another issue that was addressed with Comcast is the fact that many of their boxes, and also Eversource transformers, are being hidden by shrubs. The utilities need access to these boxes in order to complete repairs. If you have these in your yards we're asking that you keep at least 1 side completely clear of any shrubbery to allow access to the

boxes. If they, meaning Comcast or
Eversource, need to clear in order to work
they may not be as gentle.

The area for paving this year is all of Country Way, and the dead end part of Riverledge, just beyond the intersection of Riverledge and Country Way. In order

to hopefully alleviate some of the water issues we encountered last year, Jeff and I took a day to locate all the curb stops (water shutoffs) for each home in the areas where the paving is planned.

Once the stop was located, a PVC collar was installed in order to facilitate locating the shutoff under an emergency situation. We ask that you please be sure your shutoff stays visible at all times.

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for pickup.

Let's talk about Work Orders. Spring is a very busy time with residents cleaning up their yards, and the Work Orders that come in are quite prolific. I want to make you all aware that on the Work Order it states "Please be advised that completion of the Work Order may take up to five to ten working days, depending on the type/amount of work to be done". That being said, if it has not been 5 to 10 working days it is not necessary for you to fill out multiple work orders, call, text or email asking when it will be completed. Let's please be patient. Work orders are completed in the order in which they are received unless it is an emergency. Thank you for your understanding!!!

A few little things to bring up. We ask once again that any cardboard boxes be broken down before you put them at the road's edge for pickup. We had quite a few very large boxes this week and unfortunately, they take up quite a bit of space in the back of the truck.

Many have asked when the roads will be swept this year. We are on the waiting list for this to be done. They assured me they will be here as soon as possible but as you can imagine, it is a very busy time of year for them as well.

We are planning another Flag Day ceremony this year. It will be held on Saturday, June 11th at 10:00AM. If you have not attended in the past, you may wish to do so. It is an impressive ceremony in which you can dispose of your tattered or faded flags in a respectful manner.

IT'S COMING!!! Finally, I happy to announce that our trash truck is scheduled to be delivered either next Monday the 25th or Tuesday the 26th. No, it will not be used on Wednesday since we still have to have it inspected in NH and it also has to be registered. It's been a slow process but hopefully it will be well worth the wait.

Well, enough said! Sorry it was a lengthy one this month but we just want to be sure the residents are kept well informed.

SPRING HAS RETURNED TO MEDVIL AND IT'S TIME TO...

CLEAN UP THE OUTSIDE OF YOUR HOMES

Rule D. Sites, #3 states, in part, "The maintenance, appearance and cleanup of lot yards are the homeowners responsibility. Yards are to be kept neat and free of debris and yard tools." Raking your leaves prevents your neighbors from picking up your leaves after they've blown across the street.

Remember that leaf bags need to be able to be lifted so please don't fill them. If you can't lift it we can't either.

Put your yard maintenance equipment in your shed.

PET REMINDERS

Whether it's on the side of the road, or in one of Medvil's common areas, please remember to pick up after your dog. Don't let your dog pee on anyone's lawn or on our blueberry bushes. It's not nice and once a dog marks their spot, every dog is going to mark the same spot which leads to lawn damage. Some people spend a lot of time and money on their lawns so be courteous. Cats are not to be loose and should be secured in your home or on a leash if they want a bit of fresh air.

BEAUTIFICATION

Remember to submit any plans on your landscaping. Don't dig or plant before you have approval. This also applies to cutting, removing, or trimming trees. Rule D #8, 9 and 10

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WATERING AND IRRIGATION

Remember to check out Rule D sections 10 and 11 for details. Essentially watering is allowed every other day and is to be limited to 20 minutes per zone.

SMOKERS AND WALKERS

Please dispose of your cigarettes and water bottles in the appropriate receptacles or take them back home with you to dispose them.

VEHICLES AND GOLF CARTS

We have a speed limit of 15 mph for all vehicles, and they must all follow the rules of the road. Vehicles can be washed no more than once a week in your driveway.

These are all complaints made at coffee houses and at board meetings so please do your part to keep our community looking its best and safe for all.

TASTY TIDBITS

By any chance do you happen to have one of those handy devices known as a Spiralizer hidden away in a kitchen cupboard? I'll bet a lot of us have forgotten that we own one of these tools that were all the craze a few years ago. Well, now's the perfect time to get it out, just in time to make a salad or two for the upcoming Memorial Day family picnic or barbecue. Here are a couple of recipes to get you started.

Zucchini, Squash and Apple Salad with Nuts and Berries

Ingredients:

2 large zucchinis, spiralized into thin strands

2 large yellow squashes, spiralized into thin strands

1 Gala or Fuji apple, spiralized into thick strands

1 Tbs. olive oil

1 small yellow onion, diced

2 or 3 stalks celery, diced

1 cup pistachio, shelled and diced

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1 small bunch scallions (green parts only), finely chopped

1/2 cup cranberries (blueberries will also work, but will be sweeter), finely chopped
1 bunch flat-leaf parsley, finely chopped
Juice of 1 large lemon
Salt & pepper

Directions:

- Boil a large pot of lightly salted water
- Add spiralized zucchini and squash to water and cook until just tender, about 3-5 minutes
- Drain well and set aside to cool
- Toss spiralized apple with lemon juice to add flavor and prevent browning, then set aside
- Heat 1/2 Tbs. olive oil in a heavy-bottomed skillet. Add the onion and celery and sauté until softened, about 5-8 minutes. Don't brown; just cook until wilted and softened.
- When it has cooled, turn out into a large bowl. Add berries, scallions and parsley. Toss well. Add vegetable strands, pistachios, and apple strands. Drizzle with the remaining olive oil. Season with salt, pepper, and additional lemon juice to taste.
- Refrigerate for at least 20 minutes before serving. Serves 4.

Greek Salad

Ingredients:

4 cups zucchini, spiralized into thick rings

- 1 bunch green onions, sliced
- 1 basket cherry tomatoes, cut in half
- 1 package (8 ounces) white mushrooms, sliced
- 1 large bell pepper, seeded, sliced into matchsticks
- 1 4-ounce can pitted black olives, drained
- 1 cup feta cheese, crumbled

2 large garlic cloves, minced 2 tsp. basil 1-1/2 tsp. oregano 1/2 tsp. black pepper 1/2 cup olive oil 1/2 cup red wine vinegar

Directions:

- Blanch the zucchini if you want softer noodles; otherwise, leave raw
- In a large bowl, combine the oil, vinegar, garlic, basil, oregano and pepper. Whisk to blend.
- Add the remaining ingredients, including zucchini noodles, and toss to distribute the dressing evenly.
- Chill overnight to allow flavors to blend. Serve chilled.


