



ELECTION DAY INFORMATION

Bring the proper ID to the polls. If you are not sure what to bring go to https://www.elections.virginia.gov/registration/photo-ids-required-to-vote/

- You have the right to select virtually anyone to assist you at the polls, if needed. (Except your employer or union agent)
- You have the right to cast a provisional ballot, at least. * never leave without casting at least a provisional ballot *
- If you are in line at the time the polls close, you are able to vote. #StayInLine If you are using a paper ballot and make an error, you are allowed to spoil that ballot and get a new one.

1-866-OUR-VOTE

The NAACP and coalition partners will staff an election protection hotline (1-866 -OUR-VOTE). Over 2,000 lawyers, law students, and paralegals are working to make the NAACP Election Day efforts a success.

Top 5 reasons to call voter protection:

- Polling Location either not open on time or closed early
- Polling Location Moved, no notice
- Voter Prevented from Voting especially when in the correct precinct, having the correct ID
- Not allowed assistance or given assistance when required

Intimidation or misinformation by polling officials

Virginia has a long and ugly history of voter disenfranchisement and suppression. In the past, tactics like poll taxes and literacy tests kept Black voters from casting ballots; today, we see measures like voter ID laws, voting rights stripped from returning citizens, malfunctioning and inse-

cure voting machines, and long lines.

Virginia's General Election will be held on November 3, 2020.

Things to remember:

Polling locations are open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Election Day.

If you are standing in line at 7p.m., you must be allowed to vote.

Bring ID with you! You will be asked to provide ID to vote, but if you don't have a form of acceptable ID, you can sign a statement confirming your identity and must be allowed to cast a regular ballot.

President James Victor's Focus for 2020-2022

The following is a statement of objectives which I feel we need to prioritize going forward considering the current social, political, and spiritual climate. They are merely listed but not in any ascending or descending order of importance. I imagine that some of these ideas are already in the works or are long-standing ministry efforts of the Convention; however, the contemporary contexts mandates emphasis.

- A voting education, registration, and GOTV campaign emphasizing early voting which begins in the Commonwealth on September 17th.
- As the Census concludes at the end of September, we need to have a push for BGC churches to emphasize participation and registration.
- ♦ Mental Health Wellness Webinars

- History/Oral History Project to update the convention's illustrious history
- Committee on Inclusion to ensure and augment both gender and age inclusion
- On-line Tutoring developed across the state for students who must now learn in virtual classrooms
- Seminars/Webinars for developing an On-line presence for churches, especially in rural precincts
- Round-Table talks or even TED style talks from subject matter experts from the School of Theology and other places about what Church will look like in the future after the seismic shifts brought on by the pandemic

- Some effort to address food insecurity by pairing Black farmers with Black Churches to develop a distribution network
- Have discussion about developing a long-range strategic plan that is not personality/ presidentially driven to ensure the future direction of the Convention. With the tenure of the president being reduced to a two -year term, coupled with the quick shifts in context in the Commonwealth, we need direction for the Convention that outlast the presidency of any elected leader in order to maintain the Convention's relevance.

We can be the CHANGE that we seek in our neighborhoods, communities, counties, cities, states, nations, and world. Our commission is worldwide, and we must see ourselves in changing the world.

BGCVA Advent 2020

First Sunday In Advent 2020 Week 1 – HOPE November 29, 2020

PRELUDE (YOUNG ADULT)

Advent is a season of the liturgical year observed in many Christian churches as a time of expectation, waiting and preparation for both the **celebration** of the Birth of JESUS at Christmas and the return of JESUS at the Second Coming.



Advent is the beginning of the Church liturgical (calendar) year. It is the beginning of a Hope that we will see fulfilled as we culminate with a Christmas Eve/Christmas Day Worship.

As we read the texts, sing the songs, light the candles, we cannot forget that we are in the midst of a global pandemic. A pandemic that knows no respective age – young, old; no respective color – black, white, beige, brown; no respective station in life – rich, poor, or somewhere in-between. Through it all we have learned that we are really one in God's eye! What affects my brother and sister in my small portion of the world also affects my brothers and sisters all around the world. For we are all connected and praying for the same cure!

RESPONSIVE SCRIPTURE READING (Isaiah 64:1-9 – AMP)

¹Oh, that **YOU** would tear open the heavens and come down,

Older Adult: The Light that is the Word of GOD, GOD incarnate

1 Youth Leader: Let us worship as we await the arrival of the newborn king!

CONGREGATIONAL SONG – Jesus, the Light of the World!

PRAYER (Young Adult)

Oh, how we long for **YOU**, O GOD, to leave heaven and physically come to see about us! Have mercy on those 225,000+ persons who lost their battle with COVID-19 and $_4$ those who are sick with COVID-19 and in need of a healing

touch from **YOU**. **YOU** and **YOU** alone are our Heavenly GOD. We are the clay, **YOU** are the potter; we are all the work of **YOUR** hand. Have mercy on us, O GOD and bring healing to those who are sick and those who are hurting. Forgive us for doing wrong and help us to do **YOUR** will **YOUR** way!

1 Deacon (On behalf of Congregation) - Oh, look down on us, we pray, for we are all YOUR people. AMEN!

Second Sunday In Advent 2020 Week 2 – PREPARATION December 6, 2020

PRELUDE (YOUNG CHILD w/ Parent to Assist)

Today is the second Sunday in Advent. Today we will light two purple candles.

RE-LIGHT 1 PURPLE CANDLE and LIGHT A SECOND PURPLE CANDLE (PARENT)

Young Child: Why are you lighting 2 purple candles?

<u>Older Child</u>: We relight the first candle to symbolize our **HOPE** that the birth of **JESUS** brings to us. We light the second candle on the Advent Wreath to symbolize the <u>PREPARATION</u> everyone must make in their heart and mind to receive **GOD'S** gift of the **BABY JESUS**.

Scripture (Young Adult): Isaiah 40:3 - 11 (AMP)

Read scripture. The scriptures are not new. The lighting of the candles are not new. Yet, as Christians, we repeat rituals that have meaning to us. These rituals remind us that our one and only **SAVIOR** is going to come again into the world. As we wait for the second coming of **CHRIST**, we remember that our **HOPE** is on the way; and, we prepare our heart, mind, and soul to receive **CHRIST** when **He** returns.

Solo: (Led by Older Adult or Choir): Come, Thou Font of Every Blessing

Young Adult:

Last week we lit 1 purple candle to remind us that Jesus is the Light of the World. Today we light a second purple candle to remind us that we need to get ready for Christ's return. It may be a short or a long wait. However, we must be prepared whenever Christ comes back.

Young Child: We keep the **Light of CHRIST** burning bright so everyone can see!

1 Person Respond: The Light is CHRIST!

Teenager: The second purple candle reminds us to always keep the **Light of CHRIST** alive in our heart!

1 Person Respond: What can we do to keep the Light of CHRIST alive in the world?

Older Child: We can pray for people who are sick with COVID-19 and ask **GOD** to help them feel better.

1 Person Respond: The Light is the WORD OF GOD – GOD incarnate. Let us worship as we await the arrival of the

newborn King!

Solo: This Little Light of Mine

<u>Prayer (Older Adult)</u>: JESUS, we welcome YOU into our heart! Each week we add another light for YOU while we wait for YOU to come again. Help us to always let YOUR light grow brighter in our hearts every day. And so, we always welcome You into our heart. Amen.



Third Sunday In Advent WEEK 3 – JOY December 13, 2020

Prelude (Senior Adult)

L – The Advent story is one of hope, mystery, anticipation, preparation, a kingdom of this world and the next, and a

King appearing when we least expect.

P – Heaven touching earth, the footsteps of the Divine walking dusty roads as they once did in Eden; and, a people,

searching for a Savior, and walking past a stable.

L – Open our eyes and hearts, O GOD, that this might be an Advent of Joy to the world for all.

RE-LIGHT 2 PURPLE CANDLES and LIGHT the PINK CANDLE (Young child, older child and parents)

Younger Child: Why are we lighting 2 purple candles and the pick candle?

<u>Older Child</u>: We relight the first purple candle help us remember the **Hope** that the birth of **BABY JESUS** brings to all. We relight the second purple candle to help us remember the **PREPARATION** that all of us must make in our hearts and minds to receive God's gift of Baby **JESUS**.

Older Adult

So, today we light the third candle – the pink candle of **JOY**! Can you image the joy Mary must have felt? Let's listen to Mary's unspeakable joy in Luke 1:46b -55!

Scripture (Young Adult)

Luke 1:46b - 55

<u>Prayer</u> (Teenager) – (The prayer should be from the heart and about **JOY**) – using the teen's own words – **and not read**.

<u>Song of Affirmation</u> – **Unspeakable Joy* by Gospel Artist Douglas Miller. (Have a person to sing the song or use a recording of the song. You may also access a video recording of the song via U-tube).

Closing Prayer (Middle Adult)

GOD, the **GIVER** of all Life, this season is alive with the blessings of unspeakable joy. The sounds of this season remind us of the hope that is reborn second by second, day by day in each of our lives. May Christmas be more than a time of lighting candles or giving and receiving gifts. Our prayer is that this season be a time of renewed commitment to **YOU**, **O GOD**! In our daily living, may we never forget to live large enough that **YOUR** Grace is made real; that our service is sanctified by **YOU**; and, that we realize we can never out-give **YOU**. In the name of **JESUS**, **THE CHRIST CHILD** we pray...Amen!

*IN ADVANCE OF THE 3RD SUNDAY IN ADVENT, identify one or 2 persons who can sing the above song for the Advent presentation. If your soloist/choir/chorus/group is unable to sing this song, you may ask if there is someone in the congregation who can lead in the singing of the song. Or perhaps you know of someone outside of the church who would volunteer to come and sing the song. If all fails, PRAISE GOD FOR TECHNOLOGY! Check U-Tube! OR FIND ANOTHER SONG ABOUT JOY!



Fourth Sunday in Advent WEEK 4 - LOVE December 20, 2020

(ASK A FAMILY IN THE CHURCH TO LEAD THE ADVENT READINGS FOR TODAY)



Prelude (READ EXEUBRANTLY!)

Leader – Sing, people of **GOD**, sing of **GOD'S** steadfast **Love** forever!

Person – With our mouth we will proclaim the LORD'S faithfulness to all generations.

Leader – Declare that steadfast **Love** is forever established.

Person - GOD'S faithfulness is as firm as the heavens.

Leader – For a covenant has been made with the CHOSEN ONE, and GOD has sworn it.

Person – We will sing GOD'S steadfast LOVE forever!

RE-LIGHT 2 PURPLE CANDLES & PINK CANDLE (Grandparent)

Teenager 1: Why are we lighting 3 purple candles and the pink candle and then another purple candle?

Teenager 2: We relight the first purple candle help us remember the **HOPE** that the birth of **BABY JESUS** brings to all. We relight the second purple candle to help us remember the **PREPARATION** that all of us must make in our hearts and minds to receive God's gift of **BABY JESUS**. The pink candle is relit so that we will always remember the **JOY** Christ brings into our life. Today, we **light the last purple candle** to remind us of **GOD'S** never-ending **LOVE**.

These rituals remind us that our one and only Savior is going to come again into the world. BGC Food Network in Partnership with Optima Health

Healthy Foods Pantry Program

Virginians experiencing food insecurity also face health issues like diabetes and high blood pressure. Access to nutritious foods helps create a healthier population. For the proposed project, the Churches of Norfolk, VA, Baptist General Convention and Optima Health will partner to address food insecurity in the Norfolk area through a healthy foods' pantry program. Participants are screened for food insecurity and chronic health conditions, a referral is made to the healthy food pantry partner, and participants receive up to 50 pounds of healthy food each month, access to on-site nutrition activities and services with the goal of improving the participant's health and well-being. The group is to include 100 households, including referred Optima Health Medicaid members and selfreferred community members.

The Baptist General Convention will provide overall oversight of the project, including reporting on client engagement, as well as the food. The Churches of Norfolk, VA will provide the pantry and facilitate food distribution. Optima Health will be the primary referral source of consenting participants, using the Unite Us platform, based on the Department of Medical Assistance Services – Manager Care Organization Member Health Screening criteria for food insecurity and chronic conditions.

The program will be offered to Medallion and Commonwealth Coordinated Care Plus members. If the program is successful, as determined by the metrics below, the parties will seek to expand the program.

Metrics

Participants receive up to 50 pounds of healthy food each month

60% of the participants will engage

50% of the participants report their situation improved from the beginning to the end of the program

- Needs
- Food
- Chronic Disease
- Homeless Living
- Transportation
- Screening

Internal Frequently Asked Questions Healthy Foods Pantry Program

1. What is the Healthy Foods Pantry Program?

The Healthy Foods Pantry program is a social determinants of health initiative sponsored by Optima Family Care, Baptist General Convention and the Churches of Norfolk, VA to:

- Address food insecurity.
- Provide access to nutritious food.
- Encourage healthy behavior through member education and outreach.

2. Where is the program offered and when will it be offered?

Optima Health will offer this program in Norfolk year-round.

3. Who is eligible to participate?

One hundred households are eligible when at least one member meets one of the following criteria:

Food Insecurity

 During the Manager Care Organization Member Health Screening, the member responds "yes" to the question "In the past 3 months, did you worry whether your food would run out before you got money to buy more?"

Chronic Health Condition

 During the Manager Care Organization Member Health Screening, when asked the question "Has a doctor, nurse, or health care provider told you that you had/have any of the following chronic health conditions," the member responds he/she has diabetes, heart disease, or high blood pressure.

Lack of Medical Care

 During the Manager Care Organization Member Health Screening, the member responds "no" to the question "When was last medical appointment or have you been seen by a medical provider this year?

Transportation

 During the Manager Care Organization Member Health Screening, the member responds "yes" to the question "Was a



medical appointment missed because of the lack of transportation?"

Homelessness

 During the Manager Care Organization Member Health Screening, the member does not have a physical address (a place to resided).

4. What if I do not have a chronic health condition, can I still participate in the program?

If you do not have a chronic health condition, you will not be a part of the program; however, you will still be referred for services to address your food insecurity need.

5. What happens when the 100 households have been identified?

Once the 100 referrals have been made and accepted into the program, additional members will be referred to other community-based organizations for services to address their needs.

6. How does the program work?

Eligible members must:


- Complete a Manager Care Organization Member Health Screening
- Respond "yes" to food insecurity question AND have a specific chronic health condition (diabetes, heart disease or high blood pressure), then
- Referral made from Optima Health to the Baptist General Convention via the Unite Us platform for program intake, outreach and education
- Referral made from the Baptist General Convention to the Churches of Norfolk, VA via the Link to Feed platform for food pantry distribution of 50 pounds of food per month per household
- Member reports to one of the churches in Norfolk, VA listed to receive healthy food weekly every Friday, 9:30 AM – 10:30 AM

Dominion Energy & BGCVA—The Weatherization & Energy Efficiency Services Initiative

The Weatherization & Energy Efficiency Services initiative will provide an intergenerational skilled weatherization training series to enhance the Baptist General Convention of Virginia's and Rebuilding Together Richmond's engagement of nonprofits, academic institutions, government agencies, businesses, and civic communities in providing weatherization services for 15 households in need. The initiative has three significant facets, namely (1) Weatherization & Energy Efficiency Workshops, (2) Weatherization & Energy Efficiency Coaches, and (3) Weatherization & Energy Efficiency Tune-Ups. Each facet is designed to inform, to inspire, and to involve junior and high school students, disengaged young adults, college and graduate students, veterans, and selected clients who are seniors or have a disability.

(1) Weatherization & Energy Efficiency Workshops will be developed virtually and shared through the ZOOM video conferencing platform. We will invite Dominion Energy's contractors, employees, and retirees to serve as instructors for the virtual Workshops and leaders of the Tune-Ups. When in-person gatherings are safe, programming will be held at the Baptist General Convention of Virginia and the Children's Home of Virginia Baptists, which will provide its facility and buildings as learning labs for the program.

Each workshop must be created and formatted for the various age groups/ audiences by the staff and the consultants. There will be a curriculum for the areas of weatherization, energy efficiency, volunteering, the role of the coaches, and related disciplines. The instructors will teach life skills and provide hands-on experiences on practical weatherization, ecology, energy efficiency, and environmental justice.

Participants who complete the Workshops will have the opportunity to serve as a Coach to assist with performing Tune-Ups directed by RTR.

(2) Weatherization & Energy Efficiency
Coaches will work with residents of the 15

assigned households to review utility bills and provide individualized, helpful tips to help them with cost savings. Each Coach will continue to follow the clients twice before the end of the initiative to share additional information, conduct satisfaction surveys, and report on other improvements made on the home.

The Coaches will also be available for public service announcements and conversations regarding the initiative and Dominion Energy's Share Programs. Coaches can allow the clients to speak to the benefits of both the

(3) Weatherization & Energy Efficiency
Tune-Ups will provide 15 low-income
households—consisting of seniors, veterans,

partner with over forty years of experience,
we will provide weatherization and energy
efficiency recommendations and relevant
upgrades. The purposes of the Tune-Ups are
as follows:

- To reduce unnecessary energy consumptions,
- To reduce high energy costs,
- To reduce emissions that harm the environment, and
- To improve the living conditions of the home.

The Tune-Ups will be free of charge to each household. The exact services that each recipient receive may vary by home. Services may include but are not limited to, the following:

- Energy assessments
- Replacing incandescent lights with LED lights in high use areas
- Air vent and duct sealing
- Attic insulation
- Water-saving services
- Installation of energy-saving showerheads and highefficiency faucet aerators
- Wrapping water heater and hot water pipes



Preservation of African American Churches, Cemeteries, Historic Structures, Associated Land and Landmarks in Virginia



To Baptist General Convention Churches and Associations:

This is an opportunity for your church and/or association to join us in this endeavor. If interested, please fill out and return the survey.

Brief background: Many churches may be eligible based on their history of significant accomplishments to be designated as significant historical structures in Virginia and/or the United States (separate registries). The project will take your church historian or other designated persons through the process to determine if your church,

other historic buildings, schools, cemeteries may be eligible to receive designations and recognitions.

This initiative funded by Dominion Energy will enable Baptist General Convention of Virginia (BGCVA) to provide training for new and current Church Historians. These historians would research; document and archive all data related to the assigned church and would attend BGCVA sponsored training and other applicable training needed to conduct the work.

The key component to the success of this initiative involves documenting and archiving BGCVA church documents in an onsite (BGCVA) and digital archive for documents, books and digital records. This archive would also include data and documents (special occasions, association meetings, etc.) from our churches over the years. A primary outcome for this initiative will be the creation of digital archive of the history of BGCVA and the churches participating in the project. This project also includes assisting churches with researching and documenting other properties including cemeteries and other structures that could possibly be recognized for their historical significance.

NOTE: Churches that currently maintain their archives and artifacts would continue to do so but participating churches would have the option of having a digital archive accessible online.
