



From Pastor Travis's Study



Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Grace to you and peace in the name of Jesus Christ who is the healer of our brokenness:

I have recently been watching a show on HBO called The Newsroom. This show is about what goes on in the newsroom of a cable news network. It is fascinating as the writers of The Newsroom take actual news events from 2011-2013 and work them into the story of this fictional news network.

In a series of episodes, the main character, Will Mcavoy, goes on a "mission to civilize" the people around him. He begins this quest by trying to convince a gossip columnist not to write a particular story about a cast member of The Real Housewives of Orange County. (Sadly, this is an actual show on tv.) Will in his attempt to convince the writer not to write the column only backfires. She begins writing terrible stories about Will that affects the way that the public views him.

You might be asking, "Pastor, why are you talking about this?" This reminds me of how we try to tell others about Jesus. For generations this has been how people have tried to change the world by sharing Christ with others. We go on a mission to correct the way that people are living. We try to civilize them according to our standards. What if we tried something different? What if instead we showed people the fruits of the Spirit found in Galatians 5:22-23. These fruits prove that the Spirit lives in us, and if we live by these fruits there would be no cause for others to get angry with or hate us.

Our hearts may be in the right place, just as Will's, but sometimes our efforts are not received as well intentioned. Sometimes we come across as judgmental and hypocritical. If we live by the fruits of the Spirit others will be able to see Christ instead of us. May this be the way we live.

Looking ahead to this month I am excited about our Beating Guns event with Shane Claiborne. This is a timely discussion for all of us as we see news of gun violence every day on our tv screens. Then, we will go to the Veterans Field to see Shane forge a gun into a gardening tool. This is an opportunity for us to change the conversation around gun violence and gun rights.

This year brings some heartache to our gathering. At this conference we will be voting on the disaffiliation of numerous churches from the United Methodist Church. I ask that you pray for all of the delegates of the annual conference as these votes take place. Let us together pray for the future of our church, as well as, the United Methodist Church.

Leadership Team Report...

The Team has voted into acceptance a new Bethany United Methodist Church Facilities Use Agreement, dated March 20, 2023, which sets forth in derail the church's terms and binding policies with regard to the use of its grounds and facilities. The membership of Bethany is thereby entrusted with using due diligence in its use of church property for ministry purposes, and with the employment of fair, safe, and propitious asset management and stewardship in the process. These responsibilities accrue to the use of Bethany's property by members, non-members, and outside people or organizations. It is stipulated that no activities, planned or conducted, are to happen if they are in any way in opposition to the principles or practices of either Bethany or the wider United Methodist Church. Certain usage fees are noted in the Agreement that are intended to offset the church's costs in instances where its equipment is employed or its assets are consumed by (mainly but not only) non-members. All of this is to be governed by Bethany Leadership in strict cooperation with the church Trustees.

The church's audio / visual system, which has lately been causing more than a few quasi-intractable operational problems, will eventually have to be replaced with equipment that's more reliable and up to the tasks we originally wanted it to perform (and were led by the installers to believe it would). We asked Susquehanna Valley Sound and Video for ideas on that, and their suggestion, after examining the nature of our problems, is that we largely replace what we have. SV, as it calls itself, is already engaged in evaluating the whole A/V issue, but we will seek quotes for a new system from others as well.

The question arose as to why our organ's volume fades low every so often. It's believed that a pedal that at least partially governs the volume may be central to the issue by having worked loose a bit. The original provider of the organ, Robert M. Sides, will be asked to look into the situation.

The Team voted to move \$150,000 of Bethany's bank-held assets into a short-term certificate of deposit at another financial institution. This will serve several purposes - it will (a) make for more security in view of the recently-emergent possibility of viral bank failure, (b) it will, in accordance with astute research by the church Trustees, bring us a higher rate of return than almost any other relatively low-risk instrument locally assailable, and (c) bring all our bank-held accounts to well within the upper insurable limit set by the FDIC.

The hiring of our new custodian was announced as finalized. The Team is more than happy to welcome Nicole Taylor to the small but dedicated team of Bethany employees. She's a delightful combination of eagerness, joy, energy, and enthusiasm, and we know that the full membership of the church will greet her warmly.


Event in the Area.....

Trustees Report....

A few Trustee items to report:

• The ice machine is still out of commission as we are waiting for parts and Scott's Refrigeration to install. As reported last month, due to the varying voltage readings, PPL was contacted to check the supply line. They came and checked the transformer and the lines into the church and found the voltage to be within normal

- The changing of electricity and natural gas suppliers for the church, Parish House, and parsonage did not go as smoothly as expected. We should have all the details ironed out soon. In the end we will have agreements in place for either 18 or 24 months for electricity and natural gas supply on all the accounts. When finalized, the details will be shared with the Leadership Team, so that all are aware of when we need to start shopping for suppliers again to prevent it from reverting to the default rate, which is typically higher.
- One outstanding item from the kitchen inspection remains. The installation of an automatic closer on the restroom door. Poole Andersen had some closers salvaged from a recent demolition so we will not need to purchase the closer. They will be sending someone to install the closer in the near future.
- At the last Leadership Team meeting we discussed taking some of the remaining funds from the insurance claim for the fire and invest it in a short-term Certificate of Deposit at another financial institution. The purpose would be twofold:
 - We would receive a higher return on the investment
 - In light of the recent bank defaults and closures, it would reduce our balance of both accounts below the limit of FDIC insurance.

I'm checking with a couple local banks and will share the information at our upcoming meeting, so that we can take action.

Here is the quarterly report of the financial assets of the Trustees. The following balances (rounded) are as of March 31 (unless noted otherwise):

- Hudock Capital Group (Pershing) \$328.936 a decrease of \$29.282 from the last quarter. We withdrew \$40,000 for expenses this guarter. At the risk of being redundant, this is not sustainable over the long term.
- Prudential Investments \$696,081 an increase of \$31,426 from the last quarter this is our 'in lieu of flood insurance' account.
- Prudential Investments The Raudenbush Account \$72,350 an increase of \$3,209 from last guarter.
- Prudential Investments \$9,639 a decrease of \$312 from the last guarter
- BNY Mellon The Butler Trust \$209,119 an increase of \$6,651. This includes the quarterly disbursement of \$2,200, which is deposited for current expense needs.
- Milton Savings Bank Fire Restoration Fund Current Balance (Dec. 5) \$353,939 a decrease of \$9,880 from the last quarter. We had to borrow \$10,000 from the fund for current expenses, as there was a delay in receiving the funds from investments. It will be repaid in the near future.
