# Pastor's Study Desk Notes

17<sup>th</sup> Sunday Ordinary Time



ear C Luke 1

"I pray and pray and nothing is happening?" This is a common sentiment expressed by people who are struggling through difficult times. We have probably all asked at some point or another: Why isn't my prayer being answered? Similar to what we wisely do anytime we feel stuck in a problem, I recommend pausing to take a moment and reflect upon what's actually happening. If what I'm doing is not working and I've been at it awhile, then I need to stop and reset my approach. If we are stressing under a problem that we aren't breaking through to a solution with, based on what we are already doing, then we need to step back and look at it with fresh eyes! In the woodshop, if I wonder why my table won't run, and I've pushed all of the safety feature buttons 1)right and 2)in order again, then I need to step back to realize that I've likely pulled the cord out from the wall, or the circuit breaker is tripped. Or maybe if I can't find the ratchet socket I dropped when working under the truck, then I need to crawl out and look under my creeper to see that I was laying over top of it! So, in a similar way, when we have prayed and prayed for a particular outcome and nothing seems to be developing, then we need to step back and reconsider what we are experiencing.

#### Here are a couple of re-framing approaches to view the situation anew:

First, what if God is answering my prayer, but just on a slower schedule than I was hastily demanding? Is this what happens when I ask for something to be shipped to me, thinking it is coming from Tennessee, yet it turns out that it comes to me from Toronto. It is coming. I just need to be patient. Or secondly, what if God smiles at me and says 'Is that all you want? I have so much more I am giving to you, yet you need to expand your heart and open your hand more (let go of what you are clinging to) to receive my gift?" Or even thirdly, what if God, knowing the complete side-effects of my prayer's answer, is preventing me from experiencing some greater letdown or harmful consequence afterward (God knows our true good)? Many times in life we see later, how our particular prayer may have missed the mark of what was really our need (not just a want). God knows, and God hears us. Yet we must always give proper space and time for His provision of our need. God is always doing more than we realize – we see this when so often things turn out much better than we thought possible, even if after a fail of ours! Or consider our surprise about any day's events? Who would have thought? In the end, we humbly hear God say to us, "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are my ways your ways" (Isaiah 55:8) So we 1) pray, 2) trust patiently and 3) watch for our prayer's answer.

After Jesus tells the parable of the neighbor seeking bread in the middle of the night repeatedly, we may jump to the conclusion that we should obnoxiously demand and demand and demand until our satisfaction comes (similar to the Persistent Widow Parable-Luke 18:1-5). How can we reconcile the seemingly contradictory call to simply trust God, versus persistently clamoring until something happens? But, what if the persistence Jesus call for, doesn't apply to the *material* satisfaction of our desires, but rather alternatively, what if Jesus means we must *spiritually* persist in calling for an answer? Focusing not on some *thing or result that* I selfishly want, but rather raising my spirit to see the more, that God is revealing through my persistence. I must remember that materially, the 'squeaky wheel gets the grease', but also squeaky wheels shortly get replaced! The neighbor in the parable gets his bread, but we don't know what kind of bread the neighbor received (it was midnight dark, so the fellow may have given him a 10-day old bread loaf or some 'rained on' wet loaves because of unfocused exasperation and reluctance because of the hasty pressure!)

I suggest that the persistence Jesus calls for, refers to our spiritual 'seeking' of a state of contentment and peace (real satisfaction), with or without a specific material reward. Our prayer request and its fulfillment every time, will bring about the ultimate good of a spiritual state of union with God in us - His will and our peace. We should look at all levels, while activating all means for our prayer's answer. I find a 'spiritual peace' method in Jesus' follow-up teaching after telling the parable. He says, 'Ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you" (Luke 11:9). This is a three-step process of prayer resolution. First, ask—let your request be known—it shows good communication between God and you, that you speak honestly to God and express your heart's desire. It clarifies for us and in our minds what we are after. Secondly, seek—start looking around immediately using your mind to explore options—it may be that your request is already sitting at your doorstep or in your hand (how many times do we seek our car keys that are already in our hand, or eyeglasses sitting atop our heads!) Thirdly, knock -this is a bodily physical next step — begin to act on your request. The classic example here is of the farmers who pray for rain-yet they do not carry umbrellas everywhere with them. Or if I pray to be a great baseball player, then I need to practice my bat swings or throwing pitches. 'Knocking' involves the next step of preparing for the request's eventual fulfillment. If I ask for a drink of your water, do I have a cup for you to pour it in? Yet, as I hinted earlier, in summary, our prayer begins and ends with our simply trusting. God, who made us, knows us best. Jesus says in Matthew 6:8, "Your Father knows what you need before you ask him" and in Matthew 6:32 "Your heavenly Father knows all that you need."

I read somewhere, "Pray as if everything depended upon God, and act as if everything depends on you." Yes, God does God's part and we must do our part!
