Responsibilities of Provider

Behavioral, Mental, Medical and or Substance abuse information is confidential. Under Connecticut law information may be shared with others only with your written consent.

In accordance with state law, there are limitations or exceptions, which are stated below:

1. When there is a suspected case of child abuse or neglect, your treatment provider is required to notify the Child Protective Services, #800-842-2288. Individuals over the age of 65 who are suspected of being abused or neglected are also reportable to Elderly Protective Services, #800-385-4052.
2. If you, the client, threaten grave bodily harm to yourself or another person it is the responsibility of the provider to notify the appropriate persons and or authorities.
3. If legally subpoenaed your treatment records must be made available to the court.
4. Your health insurance may require the sharing of some information including diagnosis, treatment plan, ordered laboratory tests and or procedures. *Example: Genetic testing almost always triggers a review by your insurance company for necessity before authorization will be permitted.*
5. If the client is in need of further services and or treatment. A referral to another health care provider may be needed. *Examples: Neuropsychological testing for court or academic purposes, ECT treatment for worsening depression, and or hospitalization.*
