Tucker Facts – a series by Chuck Smith

How big was the Tucker factory?

In 1946 Tucker corporation secured the world's largest factory, the old "Dodge Chicago" plant on S. Cicero Avenue, that was used to produce B-29 aircraft engines during World War II. It spanned over 475 acres with the main building of the Tucker Corporation covering 93 acres, making it at one time the largest building under one roof. Today that portion of the Tucker plant houses the world-wide manufacturing for Tootsie Roll Industries and the stores of the Ford City Mall.

What are some of the features that make the Tucker special?

The Tucker is known for its "Cyclops" headlight which turns with the wheels to light around corners. It also had the first padded dash, a windshield designed to pop out on impact, a rear mounted helicopter engine capable of sustained speeds of 120 mph, independent suspension, a pre-selector transmission based on the Cord-810, a passenger safety chamber, large six passenger interior with flat floor, and an aerodynamic design with doors cut into the roofline.

Didn't Tucker have legal problems?

A Federal Grand Jury indicted Preston Tucker and several associates on charges, which included mail fraud, conspiracy, and several Securities and Exchange Commission infractions. Following one mistrial, Tucker and all defendants were found not guilty on all charges. The acquittal came too late to save "The Car of the Future", and the assets of Tucker Corporation were sold at public auction in October 1950.
