Board Meeting Minutes – May 20, 2024

Meeting was Called to Order by Peter at 6:30 p.m. Present: Patrick, Larry, Peter, Chris, Sally, Mickee, Steve, Lisa, Randy, Wayne, Phyllis and Debbie M.

<u>Treasurer Report</u>: All monies received for show, memberships, saw oil and grit have been deposited. No outstanding bills to be paid. Club financial situation is solvent.

Membership Report: Total 264 members – 229 Adult and Family memberships, 35 Junior memberships

Discussion about having printed paper name tags available at door for those members that have not purchased a formal name tag. These would be picked up at the table in the bag upon entering.

<u>Junior Club Report</u>: Not too much going on right now, new display case available at the Reach; adults would be welcome to arrange a display, although preference is for Juniors to do so. The group plans to meet in July, even though regular club is not.

Policies & Procedures review work is ongoing.

<u>Geode Report:</u> Randy asked if there had been any nibbles on the open Webmaster position. Hearing none, he said he has a friend that does this type of work. He could/would ask, although doesn't expect friend to do it for free.

Randy and Larry received an email that a Chet Volkman from Walla Walla. He says has meteorites for sale. Both Larry and Randy felt that language of the note made them uncomfortable with the veracity of the offer. Questions were "Is he a member of Walla Walla club?" "Have they been authenticated?" "Would he take them to Portland State for authentication?" Randy shared the note with a member known to collect meteorites and took the action to get back to Mr. Volkman declining to post it to the Geode since he wasn't a club member as well as providing contact information to the Walla Walla club for Mr. Volkman.

<u>Programs:</u> June meeting – tailgating begins at 5:30 p.m. rather than 6 or 6:30 p.m. No regular club meeting in July; although the Juniors will meet.

Old Business: Discussion about the club supply of saw oil and grit: Do we want to buy more oil? Who will store and dispense it? In the past we order and have drum delivered, and Club provides the pump. Believe last cost was \$12.00 per gallon.

Had an inquiry about someone wanted to get two Geodes cut... is willing to pay...this brings up the question does the Club wants to keep a list of member volunteers willing to have these types of inquiries forwarded to them?

Patrick has all the Library materials. Should mention in Geode that we have these available.

Patrick has 8 people signed up for the June 7 and 8 Field Trip to the Spectrum Mine in Oregon. It is approx. a 7 hour drive. Attendees are encouraged to bring a spare tire as the road is "brutal."

Flat Lap Cabbing Classes and Social/Crafting Gathering to Begin

Beginning July 15th, cabbing classes will be held every Monday and Tuesday from 5:30 to 9 PM. Adult club members only. No children, please. Do not bring thundereggs or geodes to cut, or any thick material. An assortment of slabs will be available. Beginners are certainly welcomed!

The first visit is \$10. After that, the club charges \$2.00 an hour, which is to be paid at the end of each class. The fees go to replenishing the materials used for the class.

The classes will be held at Mickee Madden's workshop in Kennewick. A sign-up sheet will be available at the June meeting. You can also call her at 509-438-5798 to sign up or ask questions. She will call you to give directions to her home the week before.

Mickee would also like to form a social/crafting club within our club, meeting in her workshop. The initial gathering will be July 21st, from 1 to 3 PM, to choose what days would work best for everyone, and to choose a project to begin with. There is no charge for this. With each project, though, the members will need to have their own materials and tools.

Examples include: Different forms of wire-wrapping; chainmaille, making rock buddy creatures out of tumbled stones; gem trees; etc. It's about whatever the group wants to tackle, one project at a time.

Mickee felt that the Auction portion of our April Show was too, too big. There weren't enough people manning the area to keep an eye on everything. Apparently, someone altered another persons' slip so that it read \$50 instead of \$180 dollars and this person (and the Club!) lost money. It is too fast and chaotic for only 4 people to handle and keep flow going. Mickee will provide a drawing to Larry of how she thinks the area should be set up for next year.

Mickee would like to take on two young people to train how to do the auction correctly. She would watch them the entire time the first year.

Mickee also brought up that the Club needs to hire people to take down the show in future years. The people that ended up having to do the heavy lifting at the end were mostly retiree-aged people who shouldn't have been doing any heavy lifting.

Larry said he is thinking about adding two additional vendors next year to cover the anticipated cost increase. This brought up discussion around how the vendors did this year, what type of vendor(s) to add, vendors not wanting to compete with each other, rotating a couple of vendors each year, and that dealers prefer less dealers rather than more. We had a good mix this year, without a lot of duplication. There was a lot of "late" interest.

Sally asked if there had been any interest in the positions available – e.g. Librarian and Treasurer. There had not, so Sally suggested Larry temporarily be the treasurer, as he is already on the account. Debbie M. offered to assist/apprentice so Larry wouldn't have too much work. Discussion ended with Debbie accepting Secretary/Treasurer dual role until a new Secretary is found, whereupon she would transfer to Treasurer solely. Voice vote passed.

New Business

Mickee is setting up her shop to have Cabbing Classes. She will get the Club equipment from Larry. There was discussion about how much to charge, ending with a probable \$10 initial fee and \$2.00 per hour. Attendees will need to be Club members and will have to sign the Club Safety Waiver. Class size will be limited and a record will be kept for the monies collected.

Mickee also plans to host a lapidary Social Club at her home. This would be free and topics and handson work will change as the group decides. It is for what people want to do and to have others to do them with. Examples included wire wrap, chain-mail, rocks, and rock buddies.

Silversmithing class arrangements are coming together. Will be either a two or three-day event, probably after the Fair. There is going to be a 10 person minimum. Cost will be \$80 per session and will have to be PREPAID. The first day attendees would make a pendant, the second day would be making rings, and the third day, should we choose to have one, would be whatever they want.

It's Field Trip Time - Remember the Federation Code of Ethics

Lakeside Gem and Mineral Club, Inc. endorses the Code of Ethics adopted by the American Federation of Mineralogical Societies. It also informs its members that several State and Federal agencies regulate collection of rocks, minerals and fossils found on public lands within their jurisdictions. One example is BLM regulations for Rockhounding on Public Lands provided at http://www.blm.gov/or/ American Federation of Mineralogical Societies

CODE OF ETHICS

A large measure of the enjoyment of our hobby consists of collecting in the field. For that reason, the members are proud to endorse the following Code of Ethics:

- I will respect both private and public property and will do no collecting on privately-owned land without permission from the owner.
- I will keep informed on all laws, regulations or rules governing collecting on public lands and will observe them.
- I will, to the best of my ability, ascertain the boundary lines of property on which I plan to collect.
- I will use no firearms or blasting material in collecting areas.
- I will cause no willful damage to property of any kind such as fences, signs, buildings, etc.
- I will leave all gates as found.
- I will build fires only in designated or safe places and will be certain they are completely extinguished before leaving the area.
- I will discard no burning material matches, cigarettes, etc.
- I will fill all excavation holes which may be dangerous to livestock.
- I will not contaminate wells, creeks, or other water supplies.
- I will cause no willful damage to collecting material and will take home only what I can reasonably use.
- I will practice conservation and undertake to utilize fully and well the materials I have collected and will recycle my surplus for the pleasure and benefit of others.
- I will support the rockhound project H.E.L.P. (Help Eliminate Litter Please) and will leave all collecting areas devoid of litter, regardless of how found.
- I will cooperate with field-trip leaders and those in designated authority in all collecting areas.
- I will report to my club or federation officers, Bureau of Land Management or other authorities, any deposit of petrified wood or other materials on public lands which should be protected for the enjoyment of future generations for public educational and scientific purposes.
- I will appreciate and protect our heritage of natural resources.
- I will observe the "Golden Rule," and will use Good Outdoor Manners and will at all times conduct myself in a manner which will add to the stature and Public Image of Rockhounds everywhere.
