Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word

- *Proverbs 8:22–31 Holy Wisdom is God’s playmate, God’s creative companion.*
- *Psalms 8 “O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth!”*
- *Romans 5:1–5 Faith matures into a well-founded hope for God’s promised glory.*
- *John 16:12–15 The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are one in perfect communion.*

The first reading and responsorial psalm extol the wonders of God’s creation, from the heavens to the earth, from the human race to the beasts of the field to the fishes of the sea. Saint Paul tells the Romans that through the Holy Spirit, God’s love has been poured into our hearts. The Holy Spirit, Jesus tells his disciples in the Gospel, glorifies the Son as the Son glorifies the Father. Through the love of God and the wonders of creation, may the Holy Spirit guide us to the Son and the Father.

Greetings! My name is Fr. Larry Hostetter, and I'm thrilled to serve you as the next pastor of St. Pius X Parish. My last assignment was at Brescia University where I served for the past 26 years, including the last 18 as president. I already know many parishioners here from my time at OCHS and at Brescia, but I'm looking forward to meeting all of you. I hope to have a short reflection in the bulletin each week; I hope you will find these words helpful

In addition to Father's Day, today is also Trinity Sunday, and the two go together wonderfully. The Holy Trinity is a central belief of Christianity, but not easily understood. What is most important is that we believe in one God who exists in three divine persons: The Father, creator of all things: the Son, the eternal Word, Jesus who is fully human and divine, and the Holy Spirit who proceeds from their eternal relationship of Love. And while this can feel very abstract, we can bring it down to a very human level by remembering that Jesus referred to God the Father as "Abba," a familiar way a child might refer to their human father. In the Garden of Gethsemane when Jesus was at his lowest, he prayed "Abba, Father, all things are possible to you. Take this cup away from me, but not what I will but what you will." (Mark 14: 36) And of course, we have the central prayer Jesus gave us—the Our Father.

It is in that spirit that we honor our earthly fathers today. Our earthly fathers are called to reflect the love, care, and compassion of God the Father. As God the Father was a source of comfort and consolation, so our dads are empowered by God's grace to do the same. Our earthly fathers are called to be a place of security, nourishment, guidance and forgiveness, just as we pray to God for our daily bread, forgiveness and grace. That is a great deal of responsibility placed on the shoulders of fathers, so today we honor them, but because they are imperfect human beings, we also support them with our love and prayers. God bless you all.

Rosaries as Decorations

Question:

I've seen people hang rosaries over the rear-view mirrors in their cars and a few of them wear them around their necks. Is it OK to do that?

Answer:

The practice of hanging a rosary or a religious medal off of the rearview mirror of one's car is a fairly popular custom across many cultures.

While there is no particular rule approving or condemning this practice, we should also be mindful of the respect and reverence due to religious objects and devotional items (i.e. sacramentals).

An important point to consider would be the reason why one chooses to place a rosary or religious medal in our cars. Is it a reminder of the protection and intercession of Mary and the saints? Does it encourage us to be mindful of God's presence, even in such a mundane task as driving? Is it an outward expression of our more private devotions?

One advantage of having a rosary or religious medal in our cars is that it can also serve as a reminder to pray when we travel, asking for protection for ourselves and for other motorists or commuters. Certainly, invoking the protection and prayers of the saints is a wonderful practice for families, helping to reinforce our belief in the communion of saints and the care and concern we owe to one another.

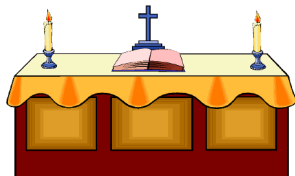
