KLONDIKE B. WINTER TAKES OWN LIFE TUESDAY MORNING

Found In Room of His Home With Bullet Wound.

The community was shocked Tuesday morning by the tragic death of Klondike B. Winter.

Mr. Winter who had not been in the best of health for some time was found in the bath room of the Winter home by his wife. The body had a bullet wound through the heart and a 32 calibre pistol lay nearby.

Justice George Dunn, acting coroner, pronounced the death a suicide. The body was found shortly after nine o'clock.

Mr. Winter was born in Pigeon and was the son of the late George B. Winter and the present Mrs. John

Allen. He spent all his life in Pigeon.

For many years he followed the barber trade, commencing when a young man. For the past number of years he has conducted "Spike's" Tavern.

He was united in marriage with Amanda Diefenbach twenty years ago.

Surviving are his widow, and one son Duane; his mother, Mrs. John Allen, Sebewaing; one brother, Norman, Detroit; one half-sister, Mrs. Flossie Edler of Pontiac.

Funeral services will be conducted today at 2 o'clock from the Winkel funeral home. Rev. Joseph Dibden will officiate. Burial will be in the Pigeon cemetery.
