Philia –Friendship Love

Life isn't always easy. Sometimes, it can get downright awful.

At any given time, without warning, we might face <u>traumatic</u> or difficult events that affect our emotional well-being, such as:

- breakup or divorce
- death of a loved one
- pandemics
- unemployment
- family problems
- personal sickness

Any of these challenges can have a significant impact on our long-term mental health.

A <u>2017 research</u> report by healthline.com suggests that if you have strong friendships, you'll probably find it easier to handle whatever life throws at you.

This study, which looked at resilience in more than 2,000 adolescents between the ages of 14 and 24, found evidence to suggest that strong friendships predicted resilience, or the ability to recover after experiencing distressful situations. The report also noted that, while family support also helped boost immediate resilience, friendship support predicted greater resilience later in life. The report went on to say, "It's possible that friendships could prove particularly beneficial for managing distress associated with family problems."


Developing and maintaining friendships is often easier said than done, especially in adulthood, when we're busy with the demands that come with being an adult.
