Ordinance O-2019-33

**ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE, DISPOSAL OR TRANSFER OF
PERSONAL PROPERTY FROM AMELIA VILLAGE
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, Amelia Village, Clermont County, Ohio (the "Village") seeks to sell, dispose or transfer certain items of personal property for which it no longer has any municipal purpose; and

WHEREAS, The sale, disposal, or transfer of personal property which no longer serves a municipal purpose for Amelia Village is a proper exercise of the Village's powers of local self-government conferred by Section 3, Article XVIII of the Ohio Constitution and of the Village Charter; and

WHEREAS, Amelia Village seeks to sell a 2008 Ford Crown Victoria Police Interceptor, VIN# 2FAFP71V38X172275; and

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of Amelia Village, Clermont County, Ohio, that:

SECTION I The Council of Amelia Village finds that it has no municipal purpose for the items of personal property identified in the attached Exhibit A, and it authorizes the sale, disposal or transfer of the item as further described in Exhibit A.

SECTION II That the Village Council does hereby dispense with the requirement that this Ordinance be read on two separate days pursuant to Section 3.03 of the Amelia Village Charter, and authorizes the adoption of this ordinance upon its first reading.

SECTION III Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of its committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION IV That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare of the Village. The reason for such necessity is to allow for the transfer of the above-stated items, which the Village no longer needs, to a municipality in need of such property as soon as possible. Therefore, provided this emergency clause receives the affirmative vote of a supermajority of all members elected to Council, this ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage at the earliest period allowed by law.

MR. FISCHER moved to suspend the rules requiring two readings on two separate dates.

MR. HACKER seconded the motion.
