Ruth Wesoloski, Chairperson 906-863-2232 From GFWC Headquarters Anti-trafficking

In early July 2024, GFWC proudly co-signed an anti-trafficking coalition letter urging the Senate to enact the Frederick Douglass Trafficking Victims Protection Act (TVPA, H.R. 5856) which is a foundational piece of anti-trafficking legislation because it governs the federal government's comprehensive response to human trafficking. The bill was approved by the House of Representatives in February 2024 by a strong bipartisan vote. Importantly, the coalition letter also urges a more comprehensive package by adding the International Trafficking Victims Protection Reauthorization Act (S. 920) recently approved by the Senate Foreign Relations Committee.

DID YOU KNOW? Health and Wellness has added this area to our newsletter to help you enjoy new uses for common products that we likely have around our homes. Did you know that baking soda has many different applications? Those who bake are familiar with its ability to mix with an acid, like vinegar or citrus juice, to produce a lighter and fluffier product. Many of you may already use it to keep your refrigerators, garbage disposals, waste baskets, carpets, and kitchen sink drains smelling fresh. Baking soda can enhance oral hygiene when used as a toothpaste or mouth wash, and it can also be used to whiten your laundry. Baking soda is also great to have on hand in your kitchen to extinguish small fires that result from oil or grease. (However, DO NOT count on a box of baking soda to extinguish large fires.) Pots, pans, sinks, and surfaces, and laundry can be brightened with baking soda; fresh produce can be washed in a baking soda bath; and it can also be used on icy surfaces to melt ice and give a little more

traction to prevent falls. That little box is certainly worth its price!
