I hope that with this newsletter we will find Lorraine Cirinelli is feeling better after surgery on her hand.



Tech Tips Tips on Getting Gas

Below is an article given to Paul Adamoff from a customer of his. The origin and author is unknown

I don't know what you guys are paying for gas - but here in CA we are paying up to \$3.75 to \$4.10 a galllon. My line of work is in petroleum for about 31 years, so here are some tricks to get more of your money's worth for every gallon. My company delivers about 4 million gallons in a 24 hour period thru a pipeline. One day is diesel, the next jet fuel and gasoline - regular and premium. We have 34 storage tanks with a total capacity of 16,800,000 gallons.

Only buy or fill up in the early morning when the ground temperature is still cold. Remember that all service stations have their storage tanks underground. The colder the ground the more dense the gasoline. When the days gets warmer gasoline expands, so buying in the afternoon or in the evening your gallon is not exactly a gallon. In the petroleum business, the specific gravity and temperature of the gasoline, diesel, ethanol and other petroleum products plays an important role.

A one degree rise in temperature is a big deal for the petroleum business. But the service stations do not have temperature compensation at the pumps.

When you are filling up do not squeeze the trigger of the nozzle to a fast mode. If you look you will see the trigger has three stages: Low, middle and high. You should be pumping on low mode thereby minimizing the vapors that are created while you are pumping. All hoses at the pump have a vapor return. If you are pumping at the fast rate, some of the liquid that goes to your tank becomes vapor. Those vapors are being sucked up and back into the underground tanks so you're getting less worth for your money.

One of the most important tips is to fill up when your tank is HALF FULL. The reason for this is the more gas you have in your tank the less air occupying an empty space. Gasoline evaporates faster than you can imagine. Gasoline storage tanks have an internal floating roof. This roof serves as zero clearance between the gas and the atmosphere, so it minimizes the evaporation.

Unlike service stations, where I work every truck that we load is temperature compensated so that every gallon is actually the exact amount.
