## Purim

The events of Purim, we all have learned since our childhood stories one very familiar. However, Purim is derived from the Persian and means "Lots" (a game similar to a raffle). The holiday was given these days (lest we forget) this year as the 14th and 15th of Adar II. These days are 17th and 18th of March. As a result, the 13th day, is a fast day called in Hebrew "Taanis Esther" and commemorates the fasting period imposed upon Jews in Persia by Queen Esther. On that day all Jews in Persia were to be executed according to the decree of Haman. As the story goes on that day Haman and his ten sons were hanged instead.

The Story After queen Vashti was banished, King Ahasuerus the Persian, ruler of Persia and media ordered a contest to select a new queen, Esther was forced by the King's officers to enter the contest. As instructed by her cousin Mordecai she entered the contest and did not tell anyone that she was Jewish. As an act of G-d, the King chose Esther to be the Persian queen. It proved to be a choice he never regretted, for Esther served him well as a trusted and devoted wife. This was appreciated by the King. Before long the love and admiration that Esther had earned was put to a supreme test.

Esther Test Haman, second to the King, requested the King's permission to kill all the Jews in the kingdom. He was enraged by the Jews, who refused to honor him as a god, and particularly by Mordecai who refused to bow down as Haman passed him every morning through the royal courtyard. Mordecai learned his plans and reported them to Queen Esther. She then prayed and fasted for three days and ordered all the Jews of Persia to do the same. After the praying and fasting she went alone to seek an audience with the King. In this act she took her life into her own hands for it was the Persian law that no one was to appear before the King without his summoning them. The King listened to her and the wicked Haman plan was reversed. Concisely Haman and his ten sons were hanged and Mordecai became the King's prime minister. As a result the Jews were saved and the anti Jews in the kingdom erased.

Everlasting Lesson There is no better proof than "history repeats itself". From the time the Israelites became a Jewish people, many nations have tried to destroy them. Nebuchadnezzar of Babylonia (now Iraq), Antiochus of Syria, and Hitler of Germany, and various Muslim people, all tried to destroy us and have failed. They had not learned the lessons taught to their predecessor Pharaoh of Egypt. G-d is with the Jews and it is by will that they will not be destroyed. They will live to set a noble example to the world of morality and care for each other and believe in him.

Our Message As Jews the story should give courage. It should assure us that no matter how hopeless a situation may seem and no matter how many Hamans arise in each generation G-d will always remember we Jews remain his chosen people. He will come to their aid in time of need if we turn to him honestly and sincerely.

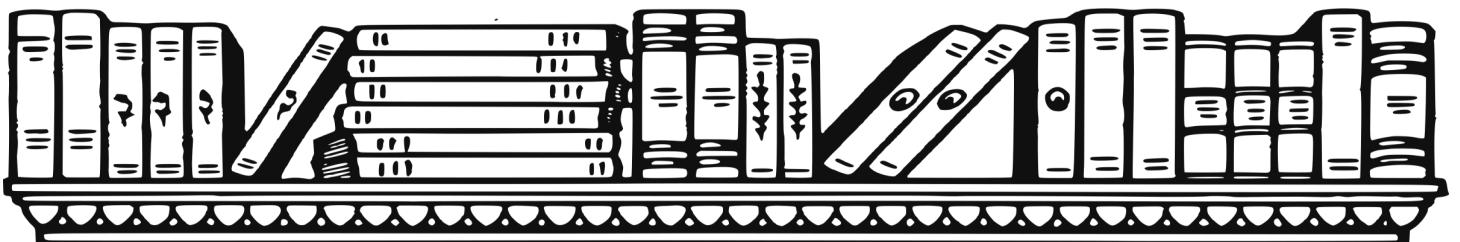


## BOOK CLUB NEWS
